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NATIONAL COMMANDER'S REPORT

MOPH Patriots, Associate Members, and Auxiliary Members,

As we reach the end of another remarkable year with the order, I find myself reflecting on the incredible journey we embarked upon together as a team. It is with great pride and gratitude that I share with you some of the remarkable accomplishments we achieved as a team. In addition, the National Adjutant, National Senior, and Junior Vice will share their list of accomplishments we have completed this year in the Order.

At the end of the National Convention last year, we had to fill a few positions like Public Relations, Gold Star Liaison, VAVS, and the Publication Committee. Before we left the National Convention we had some patriots step up on the Publication committee. Within a month the National Adjutant had stepped down, then later the National Purple Heart Trails Coordinator (due to health reasons), and then the National Legislative Director. Then next, we had three Patriots who stepped up and filled the positions of National Adjutant, Purple Heart Trails, and Legislative. With all of this, we continued with the mission. Here are a few things we accomplished, (1) Life membership rebate was distributed out, and the loan on life membership was paid on a monthly base. (2) We are working on completing the three Audits and two of the IRS 990s (2020-2021 990 was completed). (3) During this time we are moving the Order's bank accounts from PNC over to Chase Bank. (4) Also during this year, we encountered several past tax due bills and other items not filed properly. We rectified those issues to keep us operating properly. (5) We had several items from several states that popped up and were not either paid or taken care of properly. Those were also rectified and we now are on track to keep up with them in the future. (6) One major thing is that the National Adjutant got the Group EIN caught up and filed for the past seven years and now for the current year. This is an annual IRS requirement for the Order to retain its nonprofit status.

During this time we have partnered with AUSA as an affiliate partner. We also met with the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA) to work on an LOI to see if we can mutually support each other, while continuing to work with the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) on the Letter of Intent (LOI) we approved during the 2023 National Convention. We also have worked with American Income Life (AIL) who assisted us in cleaning up the Order's membership roster. The Publications Committee conducted a survey to determine if it is feasible to bring back printed version of the Purple Heart Magazine.

We strengthened the working relationship with the Auxiliary and realized that its members will always have the Order's back and support it to the end. Thank you Auxiliary members for standing beside the Order and being a part of us!!

Next, the Website has made some vast improvements such as the Reports page and adding a Chapter Directory. The Webmaster removed several items from the roster that we do not use in order make it an easier membership roster to use. He also cleaned up the Order's website, making it easier to use so we can focus on our jobs and get the information we need out quickly. The senior leadership made several trips to the MOPH headquarters; cleaned and reorganized the entire building; replaced some computers and helped make the office more efficient. Throughout the year, we've executed our missions with precision and dedication, ensuring the success of every operation. By working with the leadership at all levels on several initiatives, we made sure each endeavor was a testament to our unwavering commitment to excellence. Your dedication to continuous improvement has been evident in the support you have given to our programs. By successfully working on enhancing our skills and

We have completed some fundraising classes and joined dome groups that increase the chances to receive funds from different individuals and large corporations. We are working to join the CFC campaign in the future and generate multiple streams of income.

NATIONAL ADJUTANT'S CORNER—91ST National Convention

Greetings Patriots Associate Members, and Auxiliary Members

The Military Order of the Purple Heart's (the Order's) Leadership Team and Headquarters Staff extends their warmest welcome to the 91ST National Convention in the great City of Orlando, Florida. As National Adjutant, I extend my personal welcome and give the best wishes to all Patriots, Associates and Auxiliary Members in the Order, whether they are in attendance or not. It is my hope though, that those present have a productive and meaningful Nation Convention.

It has been my utmost pleasure and honor to have served a second term as your National Adjutant. During these past 11 months, a lot has been accomplished by the Leadership Team. Some of the accomplishments are:

- (Re)Hired) Ms. Caira Grey-Johnson as the Communications Specialist. It is great to welcome her back on the MOPH Team.
- Insurance Audit completed resulting in a refund from one insurance company.
- Changed Insurance Companies and obtained new policies resulting in a reduction in premiums on required coverages (i.e. Workers Compensation, Property Theft and Loss)
- Received the Internal Revenue Service Determination Letter on 25 March 2024 acknowledging the two EIN Audits (NOV23 and FEB24) and making the changes we requested. This will ensure that the MOPH/MOPHA National Headquarters, and active Departments, Chapters/Units will maintain their tax exempt status. However, 990Ns must still be filed with the IRS.
- Formally closed Revenue/Income Tax, Employment Tax, and Unemployment Compensation and Insurance Tax Accounts in several cities, five counties, and nine states that were still billing the MOPH even though we have not had employees there since 30JUNE2020.
- Renewed the MOPH Business Licenses in the State of Virginia (where we are based) and Washington DC (where we are chartered).
- Completed the IRS 990s for the Years 2020-2021,
- Installed the check scanner to make depositing checks received at the HQ BLDG easier without even having to leave the office.
- Shut down our old server and changed out the computer at Communications Specialist area and upgraded the Communications' and Adjutant's computers from Windows 7 to Windows 10.
- Formed an Affiliate Partnership with the Association of the United States Army that will provide some benefits at no cost to the MOPH or its members and regardless of Military Branch in which they served.
- Printed and mailed the new Charters for new, recently reactivated, or renamed Chapters.
- Did not renew the copier machine contract with Commonwealth Copiers and De Lage Landon Financial Services for the three Konica Minolta Copiers and entered into a contract with Canon Copier Solutions saving the Order over \$600.00 per month in leasing and maintenance fees.
- Participated in the "March on the Hill, 06 and 07 March 2024 visiting the Offices of key US Senators and Representatives, where the Top Three, National Adjutant, and National Inspector discussed issues that are important to the Order, which if implemented, will improve benefits received by all Veterans and thereby improving their lives.
- -Presented a National Commander's Distinguished Award to US Senator John Boozman (R- AR) for his outstanding support to the Order and the Veterans Community as a whole.

- -Presented a National Commander's Distinguished Award to US Senator Mike Rounds (R- DK) for his outstanding support to the Order, the Native American Veterans Charter and the Veterans Community as a whole.
- Participated in the US Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Day (11November2023 and Department of Defense Memorial Day (27MAY2024) Wreath Laying Ceremonies at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Arlington National Cemetery. Learned the MOPH is scheduled to sponsor the Veterans Day event in the year 2029. National Commander with the Department of Hawaii, along with the participated in the Pearl Harbor Wreath Laying Ceremony (07December2023). Estimated cost to sponsor the 2029 Veterans Day Wreath Laying Ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery is \$50,000.
- Changed several of our accounts payable from being paid by checks to either auto-pay (ACH) or thru Vendor pay ensuring our bills are paid in a full and timely manner reducing our risk to being charged late fees and penalties.
- -Worked closely with our tenants C (Upon the Path) in BLDG to ensure compliance with the terms of the lease. Approved their plans to modify and improve the building's interior.
- Reorganized the interior of BLDG B so that it is now a Headquarters to be proud of when we have visitors.
- -Revamped the Finance and Property List Reports so they are no longer submitted above the Department Level. While those reports remain within the Departments, the Chapter/Department IRS 990Ns are reported by the Departments to the National HQ.
- -Resolved an issue with the State of New York Department of Health relieving/releasing the Order from an \$18,420.00 Healthcare Reform Act Insurance Pool Bill dating back to 2023.
- Sought and obtained the resignation from four individuals who were convicted of heinous crimes that, if not resigning from the Order, would have resulted in Disciplinary Panel Hearings.
- Developed a three step notification process to encourage Patriots with temporary membership catch up on the balance of membership fees due.
- Developed a notification process to remind temporary membership Patriots who still owe the Membership Office documents supporting the award of the Purple Heart medal to send them in.
- -Developed an agreement between the Order and individuals/organizations that are either loaning or donating property/items of value to the Order.
- Closed the State of New York Department Of Health's Health Care Reform Act account saving the Order \$18,420.00.
- Coordinated with the US Department of Veterans Affairs to have the MOPH remain on the National Advisory Committee.
- -New HVAC System for the MOPH National HQ BLDG B.
- -Developed a Nondisclosure Statement for Employees/MOPH Officers ensuring that proprietary & intellectual information remains property of the Order.
- -The Agreement between the Order and MOPH Fund was signed in February 2024.
- -Received a donation of \$3,450 from American Income Life (AIL). MOPH receives a \$0.50 donation for each member that returns a beneficiary card requesting a certificate of coverage for accidental death and dismemberment (AD&D) and additional information on the other no cost benefits.
- -Working with the Finance Team, the National Finance Officer's request to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for the Order be relieved of the \$49,350.00 tax bill was approved on 24JUNE2024.

- A Special Shout Out and Thank You to Patriot Larry Leighton, Chair, National Publications Committee for the outstanding online editions of the Purple Heart Magazine and on updating the Constant Contact eMail Address list.
- A Special Shout and Thank You to Kevin and Beth Bucek for their outstanding work on the MOPH website and Social Media/Marketing platforms.

Finally, while I will not be continuing forward as the National Adjutant, I pledge to provide my successor with the assistance required for a smooth transition. I know my successor will ensure the MOPH Headquarters Team will be responsive to your requests for information and work in an open environment while protecting the rights and privacy of all concerned. As always, please treat the HQ Staff in the same respectful manner in which the next National Adjutant will expect them to treat you.

Rules of the National Convention

(Article IX, Section 5)

Rules of the National Convention, unless otherwise voted by the Convention assembled, shall be as follows: Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

Only duly accredited and registered members of the National Convention (Article IX Section 2) shall participate directly or indirectly in discussions or voice vote (hand or standing vote may be permitted) on any subject before the Convention.

The Chair may grant the floor to any visitor:

- 1) With the consent of a majority of the Convention.
- 2) This privilege shall not be extended for business or point of order.

The national convention registration fee shall be determined by the National Convention Committee but shall not be less than \$25.00 for each attendee. No person otherwise eligible shall be entitled to vote unless registered and paid such fee.

A member desiring to make a motion or address the Convention will rise, address the Chair as "Patriot Commander," state his or her name, chapter number, and office before proceeding.

At the discretion of the Presiding Officer, discussions shall be limited to three minutes to each speaker. A Patriot may be permitted to speak only once on any subject, except by the consent of two-thirds vote of the votes cast by the Convention's delegates.

Committee Chairmen may speak as frequently as may be necessary about the report of their Committee.

Voting shall be by acclamation except when these Bylaws call for:

- Division of the Assembly.
- 2. A roll call is called for and approved by a majority of votes cast by the Convention body.
- 3. The election of National Officers shall be by roll call.



Chapters shall not be entitled to any delegate votes that have:

- 1) Fewer than the minimum requirement of 12 members.
- 2) Not submitting a valid election report by June 30th.

Departments that have not submitted election reports by June 30th shall not be entitled to any votes.

The vote of Chapter/Department Commanders or Vice Commanders shall be recorded as the chapter's/department's charter vote. A commander shall not have more than one charter vote.

On a roll call vote, the department reporting officer will announce the chapter charter and delegate(s) votes

- One of the Chapter's Commanders or acting chairman of a chapter delegation shall poll the chapter's delegates and will inform the Department Re- porting Officer how the chapter's vote shall be cast.
- 2) One or more delegates of a chapter only partially represented may vote the full accredited delegate strength of the chapter.

Chapters not having any commanders or delegates present may vote automatically through their Department Commander or Vice Commanders.

- In the absence of any of the Department Commanders, a department elected officer may cast the chapters' delegates' votes provided the Department Adju- tant has notified the National Adjutant in writing.
 - a) The notification must be sent to the National Adjutant at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the national convention. Extenuating circum- stance may be considered by the credentials committee which makes a recommendation to the convention body. The convention will vote on the recommendation without discussion.
 - b) The name and title of the department-elected officer is required to be the accredited official representative of the chapters' delegate votes.



c) In the case where a Chapter is not subordinate to a Department, Chapters not having any commander or delegates present may designate the Region Commander to cast the Chapter delegate votes (refer also to Article IX, Section 5. I).

Recommendations for consideration and action of the Convention shall be in the form of resolutions as advanced by chapters, departments, or official committees.

- 1) The resolutions must be signed and dated.
- 2) The resolutions must be received by the National Adjutant at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the Convention.
 - a) A majority of the votes cast by the delegates is required for the resolution
 - (s) to be referred to the Resolutions, Bylaws, Legislative, or Rituals Committee for study, consideration, and/or recommendation.
 - b) The committee(s) may report with or without a recommendation for approval.
- Mandates and resolutions adopted at each National Convention shall be ef- effective only until the beginning of the next Convention.

Legislative resolutions are excluded from this rule and may carry over from year to year.

Voting on committee reports may be on the report as a whole or considered in part upon a majority of the votes cast.

- 1) Any part or all the report of a Convention Committee may be referred back for reconsideration or amendment by a majority vote of the votes cast by the Convention.
- 2) A motion to recommit must state the reason for the action.

Nomination for National Officers shall be from the floor. Nominating speeches are limited to one for each candidate.

If there is no election on the first vote, the name of the person receiving the lowest number of votes may be dropped, and so on in successive votes, until an election is made.







National Finance Officer Summary Report

This year a cleanup year, we were able to get all our banking and financial reporting set up online with real time numbers.

This year we brought in \$67,650.38 more revenue than anticipated, the legacy program and general donations both over performed and helped us off set not receiving any fund from the MOPH Fund this year.

We worked together as a team and were able to get our expenditures well below our projected budget. We were budgeted to spend \$708,649.73 and only spent \$592,904.17. This is all great news for next year we are currently carrying over \$334,427.00 of unrestricted funds for next year and \$134,294.00 of Restricted funds.

The unfortunate part of cleaning up the books and getting everything back on track, we were only able to work on one of our Audits. We are currently 3 years behind on Audits and 2 years behind on our 990. I know that with the new accounting capabilities we will be able to get caught up this coming year.

I and Jim Anderson, the Deputy National Finance Officer, have spent many hours getting us to the point where we are now. I know that with another year of consistency and hawkish spending we will be able to get all the Audits and 990 finished.

One area that I highly recommend we invest in is hiring a Bookkeeper, we spent this entire year with a temp Bookkeeper. We need to have some constancy in our accounting and need to ensure we never fall behind again. We did receive multiple penalties this year and will continue to get large penalties until we are fully caught up.

If we plan on trying to raise funds for our future, we need to get programs going and get back in line with our mission of helping veterans and their families. We were very fortunate this year and received over 150,000.00 in Inheritance grants. This is not a guarantee in the future.

6. 2023-2024 MOPH BUDGET ADJUSTMENT /VAVS INVESTMENT FUNDS TRANSFER

- a. **ISSUE:** During a meeting of the National Finance Committee (NFC) held on Thursday, 01 February 2024, a motion was made by NFC member Jim Anderson to transfer \$30,000.00 from the Veterans Affairs Veterans Service (VAVS) Investment Account into the 2023-2024 operating budget (see attached). The funds will be broken out and placed on the following budgetary lines:
 - (1) \$15,000.00 to be deposited in the Scholarship restricted bank account to replenish the \$15,000.00 expense this year on scholarships.
 - (2) \$5,000.00 to be allocated to cover the line item for Educational Software Instructional Classes.
 - (3) \$5,000.00 to be allocated to cover the line item for Suicide Awareness Program.
 - (4) \$5,000.00 to be allocated to cover the line item for VAVS Program.

Per Patriot Dennis Wallot, Chair of both the National Finance Committee (NFC) and the Investment Committee (IC), there is more than sufficient funds in the VAVS Investment Account to cover the request.

The Voting Members of the NFC recommend the National Executive Committee (NEC) approve the transfer. They are National Commander Ferguson, NFC Chair Wallot, NFC Member Pickart, NFC Member Anderson, and NFC Member Werthiem.

In accordance with (IAW) the Bylaws Article XII National Committees Section 4 Duties of the National Finance Committee Paragraph 4 Duties of the National Finance Committee Paragraph C, the NEC is required to approve any adjustments to the Budget.

b. **NEC BALLOT RESULTS:** A Ballot of the 77 Voting Members of the National Executive Committee (NEC) was conducted 12 to 16 February 2024 to approve or disapprove the proposed 2023-2024 MOPH Budget. The number required for a Quorum is 26.

- Activation: Because of different phone operating systems you will have one of the following options to activate the AR Purple Heart
- 1. Tap on the 3D box in the top right corner to activate the AR feature.
- 2. Scroll down past the PH medal and press "View in AR" on the blue bar.
- Deployment: Follow the on-screen instructions to deploy the AR Purple Heart.



Placement Capabilities:

The AR Purple Heart Medal offers flexible placement capabilities, allowing users to adjust its size and position it within photos or videos. Initially, the AR Purple Heart requires a vertical surface such as a wall or grave marker to anchor it into augmented reality, but once anchored, users are encouraged to experiment with moving and resizing the medal to best fit their creative vision.

Picture Taking and Sharing:

- Appropriate Moments: Take a picture at graves marked with "Purple Heart" or "PH. Use your best judgment to decide when it is appropriate to pause for a photo.
- Mindful Moment: After taking the photo, take a moment to honor the warrior for their courage.
- Social Media Sharing: If you wish to share on social media, use the hashtag #ARPurpleHeart.

As promised, the Department of Virginia has delivered the very first AR Purple Heart to the Order. - 4. Chapter 602 records were provided to me. The Financial Records and Chapter Records are maintained in an Excellent Manner. The Chapter should be commended for the excellent manner in which their records are maintained.
- 5. Chapter 617 records were reviewed. The Chapter is doing an outstanding job in maintaining their records.
- 5. Chapter 641 provided their Financial Records at the Department Convention. The records of this Chapter are maintained in an outstanding manner. Purple Heart Magazine Subscription Decision Brief

Prepared by: Larry Leighton, Chair of the National Publications Committee

For: Supreme Body, Military Order of the Purple Heart 2024 National Convention

I. Purpose:

To present information and recommendations regarding a specific course of action to the Supreme Body.

II. Background:

- a. The Purple Heart Magazine Purple Heart Magazine shall be the official publication of the Military Order of the Purple Heart of the USA, Inc. Official notices and orders published in the Purple Heart Magazine shall be deemed sufficient and lawful notice to all members for all purposes whatsoever. (Bylaws: Article XII, Section 6.F.) It is to be used to provide information relating to matters of service, rehabilitation, welfare, and service-related legislative activities and to promote the Order's social media program and national website.
- b. The Order published and distributed The Purple Heart Magazine in hard-copy format to all Members and Associate Members until 2019 when funding constraints prevented doing so. Since then, The Purple Heart Magazine has been published only in digital format.
- c. Between 2011 and 2023, copies of the digital version were finalized and distributed via Constant Contact to all Members and Associate Members with email addresses in the National profile. Digital versions were also maintained on the internet as part of a contract with Dartmouth Printing Company.
- d. Since the 2023 Convention, digital versions have been distributed via Constant Contact to all Members and Associate Members with valid email addresses in the National profile. Portable Document Format (pdf) files are maintained on and can be downloaded from the National website.
- e. Constant Contact is the primary means of distributing National Headquarters information, including The Purple Heart Magazine to the Order's membership.

III. Problem Statement:

Many Members and Associate Members are not receiving official communications from the National headquarters. This can be attributed to 1) missing or invalid email addresses in the National membership database, 2) members deliberately or unintentionally unsubscribing from digital communications, and 3) insufficient funding to print and distribute printed copies of The Purple Heart Magazine.

IV. Discussion

a. The last annual printing and postage cost to prepare and distribute six issues of 36,000 copies (30-35 pages per issue) was over \$330,000. In March 2024, the NPC sent out a survey to determine the level of interest in receiving a hard-copy magazine – for an annual subscription. It is important to note this was a survey only and not a commitment.

- b. Some interesting facts (based on the Feb 23, 2024, National Roster:
 - 47,650 Members, Associate Members, and "testing" entries
 - 14,763 Members and Associate Members without email address
 - 30,315 with an email address including:
 - 213 duplicates
 - 33 "bogus" (xx@email.com; xx@none)
 - 10,689 email addresses had unsubscribed from HQ Constant Contact (including PHM distribution)
 - 3,593 addresses marked as "bad mailing address."
- c. <u>Two identical surveys</u> were sent to asking: "How much would you pay for an annual subscription (six issues) for a printed copy of the Purple Heart Magazine? Responses were" \$30, \$24, \$18, and not at any price.
 - 1) **Paid Subscription PHM #1** was sent via Constant Contact on Mar 30 20 20,001 email addresses, 54% opened (10,043), 12% clicked on the survey (2,211), 8% bounced (1,546), and 1% unsubscribed (16). Only 1,805 responses were received (17.9% of those who opened the email).
 - 2) Paid Subscription PHM #2 was sent via USPS to 5,083 members or associates without an email address but with a valid US mailing address. This represented approximately one-third of the members and associates in this category. The number was limited to available funding and distributed equally across all six Regions. Only 122 responses were received (less than 1% of the total mailed).
 - 3) 42.7% of the total responses would be willing to pay for a subscription. The most common reason given was "I want to hold the magazine in my hand."
 - 4) 57.3% of the total responses would be NOT willing to pay for a subscription. The most common reason given was "I already gave my blood, and the magazine was included in my membership."
- d. Several courses of action have been considered and discussed.
 - 1) Option #1: Maintain Status Quo
 - a. **Pro:** No additional costs to be incurred.
 - b. **Con:** Membership continues to perceive the Command group does not want to address a known communications gap.
 - 2) **Option #2:** Adapt and Innovate
 - a. Pro:
 - i. Part of the membership perceives the Command group to be willing to address a known communications gap.
 - ii. A currently underserved and unserved portion of the membership may be reached and thereby encouraged to become more active in Chapter and Department activities.

- iii. Paid subscriptions can be offered to not only the membership but also to non-members, potential members, and potential supporters and supporting organizations.
- iv. Paid subscriptions will be used to off-set publication and distribution costs.
- v. Paid subscriptions will improve communications to a portion of the membership currently not reached.

b. Con:

- i. Increased cost to the Order.
- ii. Part of the membership perceives the Command group is willing to spend money to placate a few that could be better used for other Order programs.
- iii. An automated system will need to be developed, implemented, and managed to market subscriptions, to capture and track subscription payments and expirations, and handle undeliverable magazines (bad mailing addresses).
- iv. Distribution (postage) cost considerations may limit printed copy content and result in differences between the printed and digital versions.
- v. Does not address communications other than The Purple Heart Magazine.

V. Recommendations

- a. Based on the analysis conducted, it is recommended the Order pursue the "Adapt and Innovate" course of action. This approach addresses, at least in part, the need to improve communications with the membership by the National Headquarters.
- b. An implementation be phased in such a way that printing and distribution costs are not incurred prior to collecting sufficient subscription payments to cover those costs.

I am pleased to offer the following report from the Office of the National Purple Heart Legacy & Trail Coordinator, but prior to the details of the report I would be remiss to not first recognize my predecessor, Patriot Dan Eddinger, who bore the prestigious honor of the office and dutifully executed his responsibilities with great zeal and enthusiasm while memorializing the Purple Heart Medal and recipients thereof. His significant contributions to the Order cannot go unnoticed, as his efforts have paved the way to ensure those who sacrificed greatly as recipients of the Purple Heart will forever be inculcated in the memory of communities across our great nation.

State of the Purple Heart Trail:

Since appointment to the office in early 2024, extensive coordination efforts between the National Purple Heart Trail Coordinator, Department and Chapter Commanders, State, County and Local governments, as well as the public has occurred. These coordination efforts range from data entry of a Purple Heart Trail entity to the website, collaborating with local and county governments on potential requirements of their local Departments of Transportation, aiding in connecting potential entities with graphic designers or sign companies, connecting local veterans with patriotic members of their communities to expand knowledge and education of the Purple Heart Trail, and more.

Near Term Goal – Maintain PHTrail@purpleheart.org email address as property of the Military Order of the Purple Heart. In order to maintain effective contact with the public, governmental entities, as well as Department and Local Chapters and to ensure historic communications are retained and future contact is available at a consistent email address as opposed to using personal email addresses or masking the initial contact email address. This may require a small budgetary increase to cover the cost of Google Workspace, or another platform as deemed necessary by the Webmaster.

Intermediate Term Goal – Availability to view Purple Heart Entity Proclamations, details, and unveiling event photos on the Purple Heart Trail section of the webpage. Additional funding to support this initiative would increase public visibility, increase visibility within communities seeking Purple Heart Entity status to refine draft proclamations, and may lead to further SEO and click through rates thereby increasing ad revenues.

The MOPH works hard to assist our MOPH patriots as well as other veterans that are not a part of the MOPH. The Veteran advocacy program is the program that is here to help both the MOPH patriots and our veterans.

The main thing that we assist with is finding service officers to assist veterans with their VA claims. Unfortunately, since the MOPH currently does not have an active service program we reach out to local chapters and find the service officers that are used through that chapter. We do have members who are service officers with other organizations so we also try and reach out to them for assistance.

We do not know which members are service officers with other organizations so it would be helpful to start a database of the members who are service officers so we can reach out to them for assistance in their area.

Another issue we get contacted about a lot is assisting veteran to obtain a Purple heart for past injuries. Unfortunately, we are unable to help as the veteran or family member has to go through the Department of which the veteran served and submit the DD149 application along with medical records and 3-5 letters of verification.

We also receive other requests as well but those are the main request we receive assistance for. Below is an estimated number of what the MOPH assisted our veterans with this past year.

The Military Order of the Purple Heart was established in 1932, the year the Purple Heart award was re-instituted. In 1958, the Order received its Congressional Charter.

The Order is organized into 6 Regions with 41 Departments and 4 States that are National Chiefs of Staffs and Chapters.

RGN 1 has 5 Departments:

Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia.

RGN 2 has 11 Departments:

Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Ohio, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

RGN 3 has 6 Departments:

Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, the Dakotas (North and South) Washington, and Wyoming.

RGN 4 has 6 Departments:

Alabama, Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and the Caribbean (Puerto Rico).

RGN 5 has 7 Departments:

Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.

RGN 6 has 5 Departments:

Arizona, Asia Pacific (Guam), California, Hawaii, and Nevada.

The following states are as National Chief of Staff:

(Meaning the state has less than 2 chapters and a minimum combined membership of 100 members and associate members). Massachusetts, Montana, Tennessee, and Utah.

The following States do not have a Chapter or Department:

MOPH MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Military Order of the Purple Heart is to **foster an environment of goodwill and camaraderie among Combat Wounded Veterans, promote Patriotism, support necessary legislative initiatives**, and most importantly, provide service to all veterans and their families.

CONTROL

The National Convention meets annually. National Officers are elected/appointed at this Convention, and Bylaws' amendments and resolutions are passed for the coming year. Publication, Finance, Legislative, and By-Laws committees meet at the National Convention. The National Executive Committee (NEC) serves as the final executive authority between Conventions.

MOPH National Headquarters staff is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Order. The National Adjutant and National Financial Officer are so tasked with daily duties.

Department Conventions, Department Executive Committees, and Department Officers serve the same function at the Department level as their counterparts at the National level.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The Constitution and Bylaws are the two documents that hold the Order together and guide our actions. We must carefully read these documents, especially the Bylaws. Most questions can be answered by a careful reading of the Order's Bylaws. READ and RE-READ, before you start referring to this document.

STARTING A CHAPTER OR DEPARTMENT/RENAME A CHAPTER

It takes 12 members to start a Chapter; this number may include transfers. A Department may be started with 2 or more Chapters and at least 100 members in the state. It takes 12 members to rename a Chapter. All forms can be found at purpleheart.org after you log in click on the services tab and click MOPH Forms.

FISCAL YEAR

MOPH's 12-month period used for dues and reports is based on a fiscal year that starts on 1 July and ends on 30 June rather than the normal calendar year of 1 January to 31 December. We vote to Change it to 1 September to 30 August at the 2023 National Convention.

AUXILIARY

The Military Order of the Purple Heart of the USA, Inc., recognizes the" Auxiliary, Military Order of the Purple Heart of the USA, Inc. (MOPHA)" The purpose of the MOPHA is to assist in furthering and perpetuating the objects of the MOPH as outlined in Article III of the Constitution of the National Corporation, particularly that part that pertains to "assisting, comforting, and aiding all distressed members and their dependents.
