2	MR. CANNON: Good morning.
3	AUDIENCE: Good morning.
4	MR. CANNON: As you well know, today is an
5	important day as always. Let us look forward to it
6	together. Let us pray. Dear Heavenly Father, thank
7	you for awakening us this morning in our right mind,
8	giving us our health and strength. Let us be
9	positive about today and look forward to what you
10	have and our intentions to do. We thank you, and we
11	believe and trust you. In thy name, we pray. Amen.
12	AUDIENCE: Amen.
13	MR. FERGUSON: All right. Everybody have a
14	seat. Everybody had a good meal and good sleep last
15	night?
16	AUDIENCE:
17	MR. FERGUSON: Well, everybody's talking.
18	Everything good. So right now, we have an
19	announcement from the department commander of
20	Arizona. Please.
21	MR. GRAY: Keith Gray, department commander,
22	Arizona. We are going to withdraw our resolution so
23	we can get today's proceedings on and move along
24	faster.
25	MR. FERGUSON: Everybody understand that?

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1	AUDIENCE:
2	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you.
3	MR. FERGUSON: All right. So next, one of the
4	things I want to talk about real quick, you we
5	got behind. We're probably about four and a half to
6	five hours behind, but I'm trying to get it make
7	it up real quick. We have a lot of things we were
8	going to do Tuesday afternoon. So one of the things
9	I want to talk about, and then I'll bring the
10	individual up here trying to look to see where he
11	is at. Oh, there he is. Okay. He moved on. So one
12	of the things I want to talk about this was
13	brought up to me when I went to this Third
14	Department Convention. And this person has done a
15	lot of stuff before with a well-known company. And
16	one of the things he's passion I felt his
17	passion. I felt his virtue that was on this. And
18	his reference, how do we publicized and put the
19	Military Order of the Purple Heart out?
20	One of the things about it is, we see
21	commercials for BMW, DND, American Legion, right?
22	Wounded Warrior. You see all those things on there.
23	Why do we not have a commercial for us? The
24	Military Order of the Purple Heart, it's the metal
25	we all know that has so much meaning to it. One of

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1	the things that was right in front of me, these
2	people are making millions of dollars off of their
3	advertisement. We put that mail up there. Why
4	can't that we not be one of the richest VSOs,
5	besides being one of the poorest. The key thing is,
6	how do we get this out? Having the team, telling
7	our story, where we've been, where we've been at.
8	We got to move ourselves together as on this.
9	Can't just be one person and beating drums that's
10	here. It's got to be all of us collectively as a
11	team.
12	We want to help out our programs, our families,
13	everybody that turns around and is willing to give
14	us a hand. I don't think I've ever heard anybody
15	say no when I'm asking for some help for the
16	Military Order of the Purple Heart. They want to
17	turn around they may not be able to do a lot, but
18	some of them didn't even know who we are. I'll be
19	honest, I never do this I after I got injured,
20	it was probably six or eight years before I even
21	knew anything about the Military Order of the Purple
22	Heart. That doesn't need to happen. We need to let
23	them know who we are. So one of the things is, as
24	we were saying, this making this commercial.
25	This person has a great idea of moving and putting

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1	this out. And I'd like for you all to take a couple
2	of moments and listen to him.
3	So Harold, would you please come up to the
4	microphone? You just come up to this one and
5	address the audience. This is Harold Molbert. He's
6	a department adjutant of Louisiana.
7	MR. MOLBERT: Can I turn my
8	MR. FERGUSON: Sure. Turn around and face the
9	audience.
10	MR. MOLBERT: I had a real good job before I
11	joined the Army, but I got tired of it because I
12	didn't do much. I was the only Maytag repairman. I
13	worked for the Maytag company. Some of the top-
14	known commercial characters on TV, number one is
15	Santa Claus, Ronald McDonald, and then in the top
16	five, old, lonely Maytag. We have that same
17	commercial, even though it got bought out by
18	Whirlpool about 20 years ago. They still use that
19	same commercial year after year. And people
20	recognized the product as being reliable.
21	Wounded Warrior Project raised almost \$288
22	million last year, most of which from their
23	television ad campaign. Tunnels to Towels, they
24	started after 9-11. They asked for \$11 a month.
25	Wounded Warrior Project asked for \$19 a month. Why

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1	can't we ask for 10, or maybe more? What would it
2	cost for one commercial during prime time during the
3	week? Prime time is defined as about 1600 to one
4	2100 and over the air 30 second commercial with
5	ABC, NBC, or CBS is about \$364,000. But think about
6	the reach. What if we started off with a 30 second
7	campaign and we use you guys and you tell you
8	start off with the commercial by saying, the purpose
9	of this commercial is to educate all Americans on
10	what the Purple Heart is, means, and the sacrifice
11	we've given to our country. Wounded Warrior Project
12	is very successful. But you can be a member of
13	Wounded Warrior Project even if you weren't wounded.
14	We need seed money. How would National
15	doesn't have the money to start the commercial
16	program, so what if we use some of you guys to go on
17	TV, Fox and Friends, maybe their CBS morning news
18	shows, and talk about it and tell America the
19	commercial is coming. And in the meantime, they
20	could put up the QRC code. And the announcer, or
21	yourself, could point to it and say, you can donate
22	now, and also put the website that they could donate
23	to. Once the commercials are in place, we need to
24	have an inbound calling center. And that we
25	don't have to buy a calling center. We don't have

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1	to hire. All of that can be contracted out based on
2	call volume, inbound. If it is slower than what we
3	thought, we hired 30 intake callers phone people,
4	we can cut back. More more phone calls, we can
5	adjust. I haven't talked to too many people that
6	said it wouldn't work. Do you guys think it would
7	work?
8	AUDIENCE: No
9	MR. MOLBERT: Somebody said no. Why? Yes,
10	sir.
11	MR. HANSON: Because we don't have the money.
12	Because how do I get on TV. Because Wounded Warrior
13	has this project on a long time ago and collected
14	all that money. I have several items.
15	MR. MOLBERT: I think America still has deep
16	pockets. I understand that Wounded Warrior Project
17	started their advertising campaign and asking for so
18	much money a month, and a whole lot of other non-
19	profits adopted the same idea. Not a 100 percent
20	that it would work. But to get onto those TV shows
21	who Joey that's on Fox and Friends, he lost
22	both of his legs. He was a EOD tech. We can talk
23	to him. Morgan Freeman is a former Marine, and he's
24	from Mississippi. We can talk to people. We can
25	talk to their public affairs people and ask them if

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1	we can be invited onto these shows.
2	MR. WALLOT: We can't get 100 percent
3	participation from the members here to send into our
4	Legacy fund. I mean, it starts at home. If we
5	can't get it going here, how do we expect the rest
6	of the nation to help us out?
7	MR. RANDOLPH: They started that by asking for
8	17.82 a months.
9	MR. MOLBERT: \$17.82 on what? A national
10	commercial campaign?
11	MR. RANDOLPH: No. When we tried to do it
12	internally here
13	MR. FERGUSON: Guys, if you if you're going
14	to come talk with us, it comes to the microphone.
15	I'm sorry. So that way we get it in the minutes.
16	MR. RANDOLPH: The foundation tried this, by
17	the way.
18	MR. MOLBERT: We won't know unless we try.
19	MR. RANDOLPH: Not our foundation, The Purple
20	Heart Foundation
21	MR. MOLBERT: Right
22	MR. RANDOLPH: went on Fox and Friends
23	MR. MOLBERT: I don't want to be the turd in
24	the punch bowl here, but the the foundation
25	Purple Heart Foundation went on Fox on Friend Fox

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1	and Friends on August the 7th, Purple Heart Day.
2	Jim Blaylock and, I think, a double amputee, and
3	some others. Anyway. And they and they got
4	great publicity. They tried the same thing. They
5	had a they set up a call center in in
6	Virginia. I believe they had a hundred workstations
7	in that call center. They did cold calling for
8	whatever. And let you all know how greatly
9	successful the foundation has been. I mean, they're
10	not getting crap. So you know, it takes money to
11	make money. I agree. And we've heard all this, we
12	need to get this celebrity and such, but we've
13	I'm just telling you, we've been unsuccessful at
14	this point. And the response of our membership to
15	our simple, little 17.82 a month Legacy campaign was
16	pathetic. I think we raised 500 bucks or something
17	like that.
18	MR. RIVERA: PNC Rivera. So the Legacy program
19	that we currently have right now has built up
20	through the years that it was started. It actually
21	brought in \$17,000 last year. So that Legacy
22	program, we have people that you can go onto our
23	website, and you can sign up, and it's 19.95 a month
24	or any amount you want. So we thought that that
25	program was okay. Nobody's doing it. But I can

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1	tell you that it's actually building up. So you
2	start with you know, \$17,000 a year is pretty
3	decent. My recommendation would be to take that and
4	advance that program out.
5	One of the things we have to remember is we
6	have to be very careful because we are not
7	authorized to utilize the word mark Purple Heart
8	without permission of the foundation. So that's a
9	caveat to all this. You know, these are great
10	programs, but if we don't get permission from the
11	foundation to utilize the word mark Purple Heart, I
12	guarantee you that if we did a program like that,
13	they would hit a lawsuit on us immediately.
14	MR. RANDOLPH: We're allowed to use the
15	Military Order of the Purple Heart
16	MS. BROWN-GREENE: Who just said that?
17	MR. RANDOLPH: Not Purple Heart.
18	MR. FERGUSON: We're not allowed to use the
19	words Purple Heart without their permission, for
20	fundraising, anyway.
21	MS. BROWN-GREENE: Okay. Hold on. Hold on for
22	a second.
23	MR. CANNON: Identify yourselves at the
24	microphones.
25	MS. BROWN-GREENE: Hold on. Hold on a second.

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1	If you comment, please state your name because this
2	is going in the minutes. So she does not have to
3	try to figure out who you are, please state your
4	name before you make the comment.
5	MR. FERGUSON: Department commander from Texas.
6	MR. MATTHEW: Good? All right. Michael
7	Matthew Department of Texas commander. So I'll just
8	say and speak on my behalf, but you also have
9	another department commander who can verify
10	everything I say. I'm a national campaign team
11	member for the Wounded Warrior Project. The
12	commercials that you guys see for the Wounded
13	Warrior Project, if you look, I was a little
14	skinnier and had less hair back then, but I've been
15	in about three of the commercial, okay? And so, one
16	of the things that Wounded Warrior Project has
17	allowed me to do as a national campaign team member
18	is anytime I speak, I'm allowed to say that I'm a
19	part of the Military Order of the Purple Heart.
20	Now, I know we probably don't get any money from
21	that, but it does at least show that there is an
22	organization out there. And I'm in a lot of
23	commercials, and I travel all over the country and
24	speak. And anytime I get up, one of the first
25	things I say is that I'm a member of the Military

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Order of the Purple Heart.

1

2 So this can definitely work. I will tell you 3 that when the Wounded Warrior Project first started 4 doing these commercials about ten years ago, they 5 did not think that it was going to work. I was on 6 the Hallmark Channel. I would get calls and texts 7 from my aunts and uncles saying that they saw me 8 while watching Texas Ranger or something like that. 9 But it works. All we have to do is just do the work 10 and continue to do it. Don't -- don't stop. Once it 11 gets going, it's going to be a little rough, but I 12 promise you it will work to help us get our name out 13 there. It will work to help us raise funds. 14 Because there are a lot of people that when you say 15 that you are a Purple Heart recipient, they gladly 16 The State of Texas, my guys can tell want to give. 17 you, we have people that will come up to us and 18 I'm doing an event for Purple Heart support us. 19 Day. The entire event is paid for and sponsored. Ι 20 don't have to pull out a single penny from the 21 department to put this event on because it's all 22 paid for and sponsored simply by saying, we're 23 Purple Heart recipients and we want to do something 24 for a Purple Heart recipient. 25

So I would strongly suggest that we look a



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1	little further into this. And if you don't want to
2	spend the money, there's always things like YouTube
3	and Facebook that you can do for absolutely free. A
4	15-second clip on YouTube is absolutely free and you
5	can receive streams of income from it every time
6	someone clicks on that. Thank you.
7	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you, Department Commander.
8	Department of Pennsylvania?
9	MR. SEGWAN: Shawn Segwan, Department of
10	Pennsylvania. I think at this point, everybody
11	knows I've worked for the Wounded Warrior Project.
12	I've been working for them for seven years. I've
13	been a Purple Heart member and recipient for a heck
14	of a lot longer than that. Well, I agree. Getting
15	our name out there is a big one. We need to be
16	working on some of the smaller stuff, too. I
17	brought it up there on the finance committee. Like,
18	I get a commercial. Commercial might be a great one.
19	I actually greatly agree with that in there because
20	my son and daughter have no idea what a television
21	cable channel is. They stream everything. So
22	instead of going for a commercial, paid advertising
23	that might be 300,000, we're probably getting more
24	bang for our buck doing something like getting one
25	of those pop-up ads playing during YouTube videos.

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Because those aggravate the living crap out of my 2 children. And I know you guys have no idea what 3 it's like. But that's there.

4 One of the things I brought up in the finance 5 meeting that I would highly recommend is there's a 6 lot of free options that we are not doing as an 7 organization that would make a lot of sense. The 8 first one is public service announcements. We are 9 all across the frigging nation. If we have a preset 10 of public service announcements that are free, local 11 chapters can send those to those local radio stations. And now we are being broadcast across the 12 13 nation for free. Mind you, they'll fit it into the 14 spots where they do it. But every radio station has 15 a mouth that they're going to want to do that counts 16 to them as giving -- that counts to them as the tax 17 write off and all that fun stuff. So having those 18 PSAs going across the nation, at least audio, 19 reminds people that the Military Order of the Purple 20 Heart exists.

21 The other thing I would highly recommend, and 22 I'm going to throw him under the bus because he's 23 going to be a bigger expert than me, but the 24 gentleman that was just talking. We have Purple 25 Heart recipients all across the nation. I qo to

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1	conferences all the time. And I never see one of us
2	as one of the guest speakers. When you go up get
3	up there in front of a guest speaker, that's not me
4	asking for a donation. That's not me, you know,
5	doing that side of the house. When they're having a
6	conference about the effects of mental health on
7	veterans, this is the crew that knows. This is the
8	crew that lived through it. This is the crew that
9	lived through it for decades after combat. These
10	are the ones that we need to be talking about, like
11	how did you make it through?
12	So you should be up on that panel talking about
13	it. Oh, by the way, they're going to put your name
14	on the marquee. Oh, by the way, Military Order of
15	the Purple Heart's going to be in the brochure. Oh,
16	by the way, we're going to have somebody in the
17	audience that's going like, hey, can you tell me a
18	little bit more? That might be a new young member or
19	that might be a donor that's like, hey, we that
20	you guys are really doing that? So the audio
21	aspect of sharing our stories is where it is. I
22	agree with the TV commercial. It is not a bad idea.
23	But sharing our stories is the key one. I'm about
24	to be cut off, and I love you guys.
25	MR. FERGUSON: I think you you're the junior

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vice of Florida, am I correct? 1 2 MR. BARNES: Yes, sir. Louis Barnes, I'm senior vice --3 4 MR. FERGUSON: 5 MR. BARNES: -- and I want to reiterate a lot 6 of what he just said works, and we appreciate the 7 honorary work this week. We had Channel 6, I went 8 We did an interview down there, had them come down. 9 in the truck and everything, and they put the 10 Nashville and the local names on it. And I saw the 11 money come in already. They had an interview with 12 the Nashville and the -- and the Florida State 13 commanders, and it went well. They even said they 14 would do anything for us. All we got to do is ask. 15 I'm not afraid to go in. I thought people ought to 16 go to get that -- go and ask. That -- they can only 17 say no. But if we do this, it's going to be spread. 18 That little bit now already helps this convention. 19 So thank you. 20 We -- I'm not afraid. I ask -- tell people 21 it's coming. It -- you'll be surprised what you 22 get. I've worked on programs right now. Some of the 23 people that donate, I say, "Happy new year." They 24 say, "What do you want for?" They don't even take

25 my name. So I'm for it, we can do it. I'll do

4	They're the guys we got to put up front and push
5	them like hell and encourage them. And I think that
6	we can do this because, listen, every one of us had
7	a can-do attitude. We've fought back from being beat
8	up, shot, blown up, whatever you want to do. We've
9	all come back from it. We're survivors. So let's
10	start acting like survivors. Let's do something
11	about it. What do we got to lose? If we don't do
12	something, we're dead. If we try something and we
13	still don't make it, we're still dead, but at least
14	we tried. Thank you.
15	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. Online.

17	commander. I agree with all this. We need to
18	change our mindset. If we want to move forward,
19	that's where we need to start. I understand that

4	know we have a lot of meetings, but guess what? We
5	need to get the Military Order of the Purple Heart a
6	recognized name out there. Every place I go
7	Purple Heart, what's oh, I know that. I got a
8	copy we got a copy here. We try to get it out
9	here in Georgia and some other places, but we need
10	to hit the people where they are. And that is what
11	other people say, social media, social intelligence.
12	I know the man that started the Wounded Warrior
13	Program. I remember that as well. Guess what?
14	It's all about marketing. We need to get in with
15	the foundation, do whatever we need to do to use our
16	name, because guess what? We have Purple Heart
17	wounds as well. It's just not the foundation of
18	the name, but so are we. So we need to move forward
19	because if we don't, we going to die on the board.
20	We can move forward. We got the younger brothers
21	right now. And as the gentleman said before,
22	they're going to be our future. And we got to set
23	them up for success.
24	There are a lot of things that we going to do
25	that done with this country. You know, every time a

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1	somebody said that you need to speak at that's
2	the only way we get the name out there. When we sit
3	don't sit by and wait for somebody to come to you
4	and say, "Oh, you're a purple heart winner," we're
5	not going to get there. We got to get out there and
6	get our name out there. And I did and you basically
7	you got to make a purpose. You got to have to
8	drive. You got to have an influence. You got to
9	motivation to make sure they know who you are and
10	what you doing. And this is something I think we
11	can fix, but we got to get going. We got to get some
12	pedals moving. And the only way to get the pedals
13	moving is by other people moving forward. We got to
14	start on the committee and see what's the best idea,
15	and we have some to get started with some ideas to
16	do that. But we got to move forward. Got to over
17	out here.
18	MR. FERGUSON: I'm asking, Commander, can we
19	move forward with this? Sounds like it's in the
20	order. That that's what I'm trying to get this
21	morning. So thank you. I'll let Harold finish up,

20	M-R-E. He called me the next day. And he's willing
21	to help me, help us with this program. And they
22	even give grants. What if we applied for a grant to
23	at least start the commercials? I'm on a lot of
24	pain meds. I've had 15 surgeries. I've had four
25	back surgeries. And I'm willing to work the first

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year whatever it takes, no charge. I'm on Social Security disability.

I have a best friend, a master sergeant I 3 4 served with in combat that lives three miles from 5 the national headquarters. And I used to work with 6 the Pentagon, so I go up to DC four or five times a 7 I just got back two weeks ago. year. So I'm 8 willing to go up to National and do whatever it 9 takes, meet with the people. I travel. I won't -- I 10 won't ask for gas money. I won't -- I can do this 11 out of my own pocket. I don't need to ask the order 12 for any funds. I'm a retired lieutenant colonel. 13 Uncle Sam took pretty good care of me.

14 What else? So the commercial wouldn't be just 15 about begging. Like other people said it would be a 16 way to educate Americans on our sacrifice. We truly 17 are unique, more unique than any other organization. 18 And Wounded Warrior Project is just so well known. 19 And I -- I think we can try. If it fails, it fails. 20 But we won't bankrupt National. We'll figure 21 something out. We'll figure out how to get the 22 I appreciate everyone's concern and support money. 23 because if we move forward with this, I can't do it 24 by myself. Thank you. 25 MR. 7	contact headquarters, they can figure out what the
8	rate is, and then obviously it would be a little
9	cheaper. So I don't know if anybody is interested
10	in that or not, I'm bringing that up in front of the
11	body. So if there's a motion on that I got a
12	clap. Go ahead. Go ahead, Craig. I got a clap,
13	I'm doing good.
14	MR. WERTHEIM: Craig Wertheim, Department of
15	Florida. Do I need to make a motion or
16	MR. FERGUSON: Make a motion if you would if
17	you'd like that, yes.
18	MR. WERTHEIM: Can I make a comment before I
19	or I make a motion? Okay. He's gone. I make a
20	motion that we accept accept this with the
21	ability to print the certificates embossed, though.
22	MR. FERGUSON: The embossing, that's going to
23	be a little different that's on that, because I
24	don't know what each chapter or each department.
25	Right now as the bulk of of the embossing, how we

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1	have to order, that is in ten to 20,000s, that's on
2	that. So in other words, we have some certificates
3	and things left, we do give out a lot of awards and
4	things that's on that. But here's the thing about
5	it, I don't know of a chapter that can do that.
6	What we're looking is using the color MOPH logo on
7	the top where the embossing is. Okay?
8	MR. WERTHEIM: I'll retract that, then I make a
9	motion to not accept this.
10	MR. FERGUSON: Okay. So we got a motion. Do
11	we get a second? Do we
12	MR. WALLOT: I'll second that. Dennis
13	Wallot.
14	MR. FERGUSON: We got a second. Discussion?
15	MR. WERTHEIM: Craig Wertheim, Department of
16	Florida. I think handing out an award, that chances
17	are that well, not chance are. That they
18	individual they take very they take pride in
19	getting that award with the medal and then that
20	certificate will probably be a a keepsake long
21	after they lose that award.
22	It means something and handing them a piece of
23	paper versus a piece of parchment with an embossed
24	raised seal means much more than us printing out a
25	certificate. And the ability to print those

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1	certificates in mass, it's going to detract from the
2	award. So I feel that if we can't go the full a 100
3	percent, then we shouldn't be doing it this way.
4	That's just my opinion, so
5	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you.
6	MR. KING: Department of Virginia, Ben King,
7	Department Commander of Virginia. I do not like
8	this idea. The embossing on the paper is important
9	and I think that needs to be sustained.
10	MR. RODGER: Phillip Rodger, Chapter 707 Palm
11	Beach County. The last three years, I've obtained
12	and delivered probably 20, 21, 22 certificates
13	through the seven counties that we work in. I would
14	have delivered more, but I just got busy driving
15	back and forth in the state.
16	They don't come with a name in it, so I figured
17	out how to get it lined up. Now they don't come
18	with a year on the year of our work, so I got to
19	figure out how to get the text in there. I'm not a
20	printer, so that makes it difficult, but and I do
21	print when I have to print a certificate out, I
22	do print it on a embossed paper.
23	But I, you know, get the whole thing, it's a
24	fold over thing to keep it nice when they move on to
25	something else. And like Patriot Wertheim said,



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1	they'll lose the ribbon, but they won't lose the
2	certificate, it will be in their bookcase somewhere.
3	And when they start realizing they need to document
4	their successes in the world of military and through
5	JROTC and ROTC, the certificate is a much better
6	thing to give them.
7	MR. FERGUSON: No problem. Thank you.
8	MR. RODGER: Thank you.
9	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you, Patriot. Yes.Charles
10	Anderson, 326?
11	MR. C. ANDERSON: 326. I'm the coordinator of
12	ROTC program in California. We issue more than 300
13	certificates and medals each year to California high
14	schools and universities. A lot of those recipients
15	send us thank-yous for whatever reason, because they
16	are the ones who did the work to earn that. But the
17	point is not one has said, damn, that was a
18	fantastic, embossed certificate.
19	The important thing to the cadets are the
20	ribbons because they wear that every day. Even the
21	medal takes a back seat to the ribbon because the
22	ribbon is on your uniform and visible every day.
23	Students in high school go up to them and say, what
24	did you get this ribbon hat is this ribbon for?
25	what does it mean?
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1	So to turn this option down, simply because you
2	can't have an embossed certificate, in my opinion,
3	and I do tend give an opinion of this because we are
4	going to do it the way we do it in California
5	anyway. But the thing is, we just want you to know,
6	hey, we appreciate that offer, and the only question
7	I have is, if they go online, are they going to be
8	signed by the commander or do we get to do that on
9	the on the department notice?
10	MR. FERGUSON: So the answer to your question,
11	they are already pre-signed and all you have to do
12	is put the cadet's name in, everything would be
13	correct. So we'll give you what all you have to
14	do is add in the cadet's name.
15	MR. C. ANDERSON: All right. Thank you, sir.
16	MR. FERGUSON: Yes, sir. We got a question
17	online from PNC Garcia? I can't hear it, is there
18	volume?
19	MR. LEIGHTON: This is Larry Leighton. I was
20	just wondering if we've done any analysis of
21	possibly providing buying the certificates
22	embossed certificates at bulk at National and then
23	distributing those to the chapters instead of using
24	their own paper?
25	MR. FERGUSON: So long story short, what he's

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1	asking real quick. Yes. We do buy already buy in
2	bulk, that's where we got it down to the price.
3	Each certificate, I'll just spit this out, costs us
4	almost around \$4 a certificate to get. That's
5	buying at ten to 20,000 certificates at the time
6	that's here. We have an arrangement with the group,
7	so they will only send us what we need per for the
8	years. So that's one of the things we have.

9 The next we are forgetting is that now we've got the folder, which is over \$5. So on that 10 11 folder, that was there 4.0 something that was on 12 here, and then you actually got the medal itself. 13 Tying the box and everything up, total cost up to \$20, around about \$17.83. But guess what? We 14 didn't count about the packing that goes in there, 15 16 the time for the employee that goes in there. So 17 we're really not making any money off the ROTC 18 Program, it breaks even on a single quarter. The 19 only way we've ever saved anything was when we did 20 it mass. PNC Garcia?

21 MR. GARCIA: Commander, thank you. Yes, sir. 22 I'm against this and the reason being, during the 23 convention, there was a comment made that some of 24 the chapters were presenting coins over the medal, 25 and doing this, it is actually the same as giving



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1 out a coin. Reason being, we have to go buy hard 2 stock paper, some of these chapters will probably 3 not do that and just go take a Xerox piece of paper 4 and give it to the -- to the cadets.

5 Now, another thing you spoke about, folders. We 6 don't need a folder, the folder goes in the trash, so all we really need is a certificate and the 7 8 medal. Another thing Patriot Leighton asked about 9 what the cost would be for the embossed things? You 10 spoke about \$17 a medal and that you really don't 11 make any money. But how is that possible if one 12 chapter, which is mine, we ordered X amount of 13 medals, we paid \$500 for the -- for the medals, it 14 was sent in bulk. It was \$5 shipping per medal, 15 \$150 per medal -- well, a \$100 for the medal that --16 for extra in that -- in that thing, because it's \$15 17 for the medals shipping, basically. So how is that 18 there's no money made? I mean, you're shipping in 19 bulk, so it doesn't cost a \$100 to send out 20, 25 20 medals. 21 MR. FERGUSON: PNC Garcia, if you heard what I 22 said earlier, the only way that the headquarters has

23 made money is by the bulk.

MR. GARCIA: Correct. So --

MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. That's what I'm trying to

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1	say. So in other words, we kind of offset some of
2	the things there. This is just an idea, we don't
3	have to do this. Everybody has been complaining
4	because the reason why we're having to pay \$20 for
5	an award I've heard this for the last two years
6	that's on this. So we're trying to look at a way
7	that we can help out with the chapters and the
8	departments.

9 Now, each one of the chapters and the departments are stating that, why do we have to pay 10 11 it? We never asked a chapter or department to pay 12 for it. We've only asked that the ROTC unit contacts 13 the chapter or the department to give the awards. There are so many of -- that they just ship to the 14 15 school and there's no presenters there, so that's 16 why we want to at least have a chapter member or a 17 department member to be there to present the awards. 18 That's the main thing, that's all that is. 19 MR. GARCIA: Thank you, Commander. 20 MR. FERGUSON: Thank you PNC Garcia. Yes, sir? 21 MR. SHELTON: Commander Steven Shelton, 22 Department of Kentucky. So not only am I Department 23 Commander of the State of Kentucky, I am a --24 actually also a JROTC instructor. One thing that I 25 have noticed in getting these medals and presenting



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1	them. So yeah. The folder is absolutely beautiful.
2	It's a waste of money. The certificate itself is a
З	great certificate, however, and I know we left the
4	last two digits off the date, so you have to put a
5	date in it, and I also realize this is a national
6	program.
7	So my suggestion is we have to fill the cadet's
8	name in, delegate signature authority so the
9	presenter can sign it because the presenter is
10	probably the guy in the picture with the cadet, and
11	they will remember that much more than somebody
12	they've never seen.
13	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. Patriot Smrt?
14	MR. SMRT: Smrt, Kentucky, reinforcing my
15	department commander, we've been petitioning this
16	for a long time. There was a decision event
17	evidently to make it instead of junior and senior,
18	just ROTC, we appreciate that was a change. But
19	I'll reinforce, no one cares. We may, but no one
20	cares that this year's national commander's name and
21	signature is on it. And I'd like to reinforce, and
22	offer as the opportunity, to delegate that signature
23	authority down there. If we're filling out the
24	paperwork, we'll fill in the signature block and get
25	a good day done. Thank you, sir.

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1	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. Major Wetzel?
2	MR. WETZEL: Yes. Senior Vice California,
3	Raymond Wetzel, is you made a comment that you buy
4	the certificates in bulk, which is approximately \$4
5	a month. Can you pass that on down to us? Can you
6	present us the certificates and with the signatures
7	or however that you want it done and then we can
8	have it printed on the certificates?
9	At my chapter, we do 63 schools a year, which
10	includes three colleges and three young marines, we
11	pay for that, our chapter does close to \$1,600. So
12	the folders, yeah, we can get folders through
13	Amazon, get purple folders, whatever it is, to put
14	the certificates in. But can you transfer the cost
15	of the \$4 for the certificates to us to where we can
16	take and have it printed out with the cadet's name
17	on it?
18	MR. FERGUSON: So let me explain first thing
19	and everybody understands, this is a national
20	program?
21	MR. WETZEL: Correct.
22	MR. FERGUSON: It's not a chapter. It's not a
23	department.
24	MR. WETZEL: Correct.
25	MR. FERGUSON: This all has to go through here.

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If you look in your convention book, we have a 1 2 certificate being printed out, and it is -- and I'm 3 not going to bust this person -- group out, but 4 they've changed and altered the certificate, and 5 that's what we're going after. If I give you a 6 blank certificate, how do I know that that's not 7 getting printed for ROTC? What if a chapter or 8 department -- and let me finish -- prints that and 9 uses it as another award?

10 That's why we control this at National, and 11 then you ask why the national commander, I'm going 12 to answer the other one, why they have to have their 13 signatures? It's a national program. So I don't 14 have a problem as a commander, if that's something 15 that the body is going to vote on, that they want to 16 give it to the department signature on there. I 17 think that it would be fine if it goes down to the 18 chapter, but that's something we have to vote. But 19 this is a national program, that's one thing we have 20 to realize, it's not a chapter.

You can always, as we know anything in there, you have to keep the standard to the program. You can add to it, because I know there are certain chapters that turn around and give money and scholarships to the kids and also know that they

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1	maybe give them a coin or something else. You can
2	add to it, but you can't take away.
3	MR. WETZEL: And I understand that, and maybe I
4	came across the wrong way. You because you said
5	that you would put a digital form online.
6	MR. FERGUSON: Right. On the access.
7	MR. WETZEL: On the access. So what I'm saying
8	is if you send us the certificates, you know, and we
9	print them out, whatever that is, because we have to
10	print out on a regular piece of paper. So why can't
11	we have the blank certificates to print what you
12	send us onto the embossed certificates?
13	MR. FERGUSON: So did you hear what I said a
14	while ago? That's something that in other words, we
15	send a blank certificate out, we will turn around
16	and how do we know that you're going to print that
17	out just for ROTC? So you had something left? Oh,
18	we didn't get an award so now we're going to make
19	the commander of Chapter 1234 has an award and they
20	have that out there, and it has an embossed seal on
21	that.
22	So there's no standardization. If this is what
23	we're going to keep for our program, just as we know
24	in the military, we keep uniformed about everything.
25	So if we're going to change this uniformity, it has

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got to be voted on as the masses that you're --1 2 MR. WETZEL: Right. 3 MR. FERGUSON: -- so again, you know, that's 4 why I'm trying -- all this is, is just a 5 presentation or a proposal. It doesn't mean that 6 this has got to be accepted. Everybody's -- the 7 number one complaint, it costs. So I've found out a 8 way to eliminate all the costs and making a 9 suggestion that's on here. 10 The other part that we got, just like you said, 11 how many people know that a school all of a sudden 12 calls you up three days before they do that, and you 13 don't have anything? So now, you are able to at 14 least get the certificate and print towards them and then you can get the medal later if you don't have 15 16 But if you order enough medals, that it. 17 certificate, you're ready to go, so it's a solution 18 for a couple of things, but go ahead. 19 MR. WETZEL: Okay. The only thing is that what 20 I was going to say is, and I understand, and I would 21 hope that with the integrity of who we are, that 22 nobody would do that, and I know that we, as a 23 chapter, would not do that. 24 MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. I surely appreciate 25 it. Thank you. Next? And then the -- this will be

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1	almost the last one because we got to continue on.
2	MR. SEGWAN: Got you. Shawn Segwan out of
3	Pennsylvania 455. I just the one thing that I
4	have that I disagree completely with, I just want to
5	throw it out there, is ever thinking any signature
6	should be on there, other than national commander.
7	When I retired, I didn't have some random delegate
8	sign my retirement paperwork, it was, you know, good
9	old president at the time. Right? It means
10	something. It shows the level of the support that
11	it is at national level, and that signature on it,
12	even if it is a pre-printed one is coming from a
13	national commander of a national organization.
14	It's also something that these kids, especially
15	the JROTC, are putting in with their college
16	applications. They might even scan a copy of it,
17	depending on what they're doing; it might be a brag
18	sheet for them. There's a whole lot of different
19	things and having that little signature is a mark of
20	honor, and I think it kind of takes away from the
21	prestige of the award. And that's not saying that
22	our chapters are any less cool, but prestige award
23	is the national award, and I should see whoever is
24	sitting at the top of the top of the panel here
25	on top of that certificate.

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1	So my son is in the Sea Cadets, I know it would
2	mean a whole hell of a lot more to him to see that
3	big seal on it than it would be to have, oh, and
4	that's my dad's signature at the bottom of the line.
5	Oh, I love you, buddy. All right. Thank you.
6	MR. FERGUSON: I got a call for a question,
7	so
8	MR. WITT: Can I speak before we call?
9	MR. FERGUSON: I got a call for the question
10	before you got up there.
11	MR. WITT: All right. Thanks.
12	MR. NEWELL: Oh, what which is it? I'm the
13	ROTC officer and I really would have appreciated
14	MR. FERGUSON: All right. I will can we let
15	one more speak and this is it?
16	MR. NEWELL: I'm Roger Newall, I'm the ROTC
17	program coordinator for youth programs. I really
18	wish someone had spoken to me and said, hey, this is
19	what we're going to do. I will tell you quite
20	honestly, the problem that we have come up with
21	because of the certificate and this, that, and the
22	next thing, and the cost of it is because we were,
23	as a national program, unable to fund the program.
24	If we bring the program back where it's funded,
25	where all you have to do is request an award, then



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1	everything can come out of national office like it
2	was, it will look proper. The only question I have
3	is I'd like my name replaced to replace the
4	adjutant's signature, since I'm the person that's
5	running this program or theoretically, I am.
6	Other than that, I appreciate all your support,
7	but guys, we need to pull it together. This is
8	this is a national program, and we need to learn how
9	to support and make it work. Thank you.
10	MR. FERGUSON: All right. So we have a motion
11	to we have a motion to disapprove this first and
12	second. All in favor for disapproval?
13	AUDIENCE: Aye.
14	MR. FERGUSON: Please show your hands so I can
15	tell?
16	MR. NEWELL: For which?
17	MR. FERGUSON: This is disapproval for
18	disapproval of doing an online certificate and
19	ordering the medals?
20	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Aye for the motion to
21	MR. FERGUSON: To disapprove it. To disapprove
22	it. Not to do this. All right. Those who do
23	approve it, please raise your hand.
24	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Now, what what was
25	that?

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1	MR. FERGUSON: So in other words, that you dis
2	you're approved to disapprove this motion. Now,
3	it was the first one that everybody raised their
4	hand. This one is for that you are or, I
5	guess, approve the disapprove. You're against the
6	disapproval.
7	AUDIENCE:
8	MR. FERGUSON: All right. All right. Let me
9	start this over again, I'm sorry. You are for
10	MR. NEWELL: Table the motion and start a new
11	motion for approval and go back.
12	MR. FERGUSON: You can't I can't do that.
13	MR. NEWELL: You can't do that?
14	MR. FERGUSON: No. No. No. The motion was to
15	disapprove what I proposed. So so those of you
16	all want to disapprove that motion, in other words,
17	or approve this motion to disapprove, all in favor,
18	raise your hands.
19	MR. NEWELL: Agree to disapprove.
20	MR. FERGUSON: Agree to disapprove. All
21	right. Thank you. All those who want to approve,
22	raise your hand?
23	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Heck yes.
24	MR. FERGUSON: Who are against this who are
25	against it is against a disapprove. We are on

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1	the same one, Terry. So in other words, again, we
2	are asking
3	MR. GARCIA: Commander Past National
4	Commander Garcia. Use the word oppose.
5	MR. FERGUSON: Opposed, thank you. I
6	appreciate that. So are all those who are opposed
7	for the disapproval of this motion, please raise
8	your hand.
9	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Ah. There we go.
10	MR. FERGUSON: I think we're going to have to
11	do division of assemblies. Okay. Sorry about that
12	guys. All those who turn around and disapprove, or
13	approve for the disapproval, please stand?
14	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: In agreement?
15	MR. FERGUSON: In agreement. Right, Craig. Go
16	ahead, Craig. But I'm just saying that this we
17	have to do this.
18	MR. WERTHEIM: If you do not want to make the
19	certificates plain paper, stand up.
20	AUDIENCE: Okay. Thank you. All right.
21	MR. GIBSON: Alan Gibson, Commander, Georgia,
22	disapproves approve to disapprove.
23	MR. FERGUSON: All those who oppose this,
24	please stand or raise your hand, whatever's most
25	capable.

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1	MR. REED: There's three different parts to it.
2	MR. FERGUSON: No. There's only there's
3	only one.
4	MR. OLIVAREZ: Is Jennifer still on the line?
5	MR. FERGUSON: So either of you want to print
6	this certificate or you don't?
7	MR. ADKINS: And this vote counts.
8	MR. FERGUSON: This is about this to print. I
9	think we made it more confusing.
10	MR. ADKINS: Yeah. The way the worksheet
11	works
12	MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. That's fine.
13	MR. ADKINS: It takes a simple majority.
14	MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. Set on majority motion.
15	MR. MIDDLETON: Motion set.
16	MR. FERGUSON: So motion has failed.
17	AUDIENCE: No. Motion passes.
18	MR. FERGUSON: Motion passes, right. Motion
19	passes to disapprove. Sorry about that. Sorry to
20	make this confusing. Let me get these next ones on
21	here. I talked to you all about the 2029 that we're
22	hosting the Arlington Veterans Day Cemetery. One of
23	the things that when I got with the VFW, I talked
24	to them this year or last year when they hosted
25	it, they said approximate cost could be around

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1	\$50,000 when you host that. So we're going to do
2	this in 2029. I'd like to turn around and make a
3	motion that we take \$35,000 from the money that
4	we've had donated in this year, put it in a
5	restricted account, earn some money off of that, and
6	put it in for the 2029, and each year add \$5,000 to
7	that. So then that way, when it comes 2029, we
8	don't have to come up and figure out how to get the
9	money.
10	MR. GRAY: Keith Gray, Department Commander of
11	Arizona, makes a motion to move \$35,000 from the
12	restricted account, adding \$5,000 annually for the
13	2029 recommendation.
14	MR. WERTHEIM: Craig Wertheim, Department of
15	Florida, second motion.
16	MR. FERGUSON: Discussion?
17	MR. SMRT: Smrt, Kentucky. I'm having a little
18	difficulty, the sort the motion sort of started
19	at the chair, at the podium, versus from the from
20	the body. And then it would got picked up there.
21	But you sort of laid out the bomb, sort of put it in
22	motion almost into motion until, obviously, the
23	Department of Arizona served. You're going to do
24	that, please step down. Thank you. I appreciate
25	it.

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MR. FERGUSON: Point taken. It's open to the 1 2 discussion. MR. GRAY: Point of order. You don't have to 3 4 step down to set what you're asking for on the 5 motion. He can say he wants a motion for something, and I reiterated what he said. 6 7 MR. FERGUSON: That's all right. Go for it. 8 MR. WALLOT: Dennis Wallot, Chairman and 9 National Finance Committee. According to the 10 bylaws, any monies that come in from donations are 11 to be appropriated by the National Finance Committee 12 and not the floor. So that motion would be moot. 13 MR. FERGUSON: So -- so the way I made the 14 motion, you're stating, is that I know that we had 15 money from infant donation, but I'm still likely 16 to --17 MR. WALLOT: Should go through the Finance 18 Committee. 19 MR. FERGUSON: Should go through the Finance 20 Committee. Okay. So I need you to just --21 MR. GRAY: Keith Gray, Department Commander of 22 Arizona, withdraws the motion. 23 MR. FERGUSON: All right. So I'd like for 24 someone to make the motion. 25 MR. MIDDLETON: Doug Middleton, delegate in

FERGUSON: Veterans Day. 10 MR. MIDDLETON: -- Veterans Day ceremony in 11 2029. 12 MR. FERGUSON: So we got a first. Do we have a 13 second? 14 MR. GRAY: Keith Gray, Department Commander 15 Arizona. Second. 16 MR. FERGUSON: Open for discussion. Any 17 discussion? All in favor. 18 AUDIENCE: Aye. 19 MR. FERGUSON: All right. Move on. Next. 20 AUDIENCE: Any opposed? 21 MR. FERGUSON: Oh, I'm sorry. Any opposed? Any 22 abstentions? Thanks. We got that noted as Patriot 23 Smrt didn't send. Thank you. And that's Patriot 24 McIntosh. Thank you. All right. Next, I want to 25 bring this up. We talked about this last year, and

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1	it was the MOPH of our legacy fund. One of the
2	things that we have is our legacy fund is being
3	collected in by the order. We talked about having
4	this moved over to the MOPH fund to collect the
5	monies for the order. Reason why we're looking at
6	that, that the order has been spending the money
7	for the programs and the funds should be collecting
8	the money for the order. This would help them out.
9	In other words, keeping the funding for them.
10	Anytime we need a request for money, they would ship
11	that over towards us. So I don't know if anybody
12	would like that, but I think that's a motion we need
13	to look at.
14	MR. RIVERA: PNC Rivera, current National
15	Finance Officer. I make a motion that we disapprove
16	this completely. We transferring an asset of an
17	organization to an organization that's supposed to
18	be raising money for us is not the way it should be
19	done. That is a \$17,000 a year program that was
20	established, and it is built up on that. And the
21	money goes directly where it needs to. The MOPH
22	Fund, Inc., is a 501 (c)(3) that needs to stand up
23	and raise its own money and give us money. We
24	shouldn't be giving them money. So I make a motion
25	that we disapprove this.

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1	MR. MIDDLETON: Doug Middleton, delegate from
2	Georgia. I second that.
3	MR. FERGUSON: Got a first and second. Open to
4	discussion.
5	MR. MCINTOSH: McIntosh, National Historian.
6	Point of order, sir, this motion again is bypassing
7	the Finance Committee. This body should not be
8	telling the Finance Committee what to do. The
9	Finance Committee reviews it, makes a decision, and
10	gives the body the opportunity to vote on it. But

3	MR. ADKINS: All right. That's Region 5
4	commander. One vote, Anderson. Department of
5	Arkansas.
6	MR. JUNSEE: Tommy Junsee, Sergeant at Arms,
7	Arkansas. 41 votes, Jim Anderson.
8	MR. ADKINS: And it's Department of Arkansas.
9	41, Jim Anderson. Department of Colorado.
10	MR. DOWDING: Peter Dowding, Department of
11	Colorado. 78 votes for Ernie Rivera.
12	MR. ADKINS: That is Department of Colorado. 78
13	votes for Rivera. Department of Kansas is absent.
14	We will go to the Department of Louisiana.
15	MR. SANTINI: Senior Vice Commander, Department
16	of Louisiana. 74 votes, Jim Anderson.
17	MR. ADKINS: All right. That is well wait a
18	minute. Where's Patriot Santini?
19	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: He went out.
20	MR. ADKINS: Okay. He's if he's going to
21	get his charter vote, he's got to come up and cast.
22	He may swallow first.
23	MR. SANTINI: Department of Louisiana, Darren
24	Santini, Commander. 74 votes, Jim Anderson.
25	MR. ADKINS: All right. That's Department of

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1	Louisiana. 74 votes, Anderson. Department of New
2	Mexico.
3	MR. NEWALL: Department of New Mexico, Roger
4	Newall, Finance Officer. 64 votes for Rivera.
5	MR. ADKINS: That is Department of New Mexico.
6	64, Rivera. Department of Oklahoma.
7	MR. REED: Senior Vice Commander Mitch Reed. 55
8	votes for Rivera.
9	MR. BELLIS: Point of order. A finance officer
10	cannot carry the department chapters that are not
11	here, only the Commander, senior or junior can carry
12	it. The finance officer can't carry that.

17	MR. ADKINS: And okay, so Department of Texas,
18	387, Jim Anderson. Thank you, sir. Moving on to
19	Region 6.
20	MR. C. ANDERSON: Region 6 Commander Charles
21	Anderson. One vote for Anderson.

23	California.
24	MS. KELLER: Department of California. 260
25	votes for Anderson.

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1	MR. ADKINS: Okay. We know that Guam is
2	absent. We'll skip that. Department of Hawaii.
3	MR. TANAKA: Hawaii. 35 votes, Jim Anderson.
4	MR. ADKINS: That's the Department of Hawaii.
5	35 for Jim Anderson. Department of Nevada.
6	MR. LEPEILET: Department of Nevada. 41 votes,

16	Arizona. All right. Coming to the head table. Ready

7	complete the National Officers, you know, the
8	headquarters level, and then we will go into Region
9	Commanders.
10	MR. GRAY: Keith Gray for
11	MR. ADKINS: Yes, sir.
12	MR. GRAY: 932 for Jim Anderson. 2,231 for
13	Ernie Rivera.
14	MR. ADKINS: Okay. Please restate it one more
15	time.
16	MR. GRAY: Absolutely. 932 for Jim Anderson.
17	2,231 for Ernie Rivera.
18	MR. ADKINS: We have a finance officer. All
19	right. We are now going to start with the regions.

22	unanimous, unopposed vote for Larry Rupp.

22	Commander Region 5? Any other nominations Commander
23	Region 5? Hearing none. Region 6.
24	MS. KELLER: Department of California nominates
25	Charles Anderson as Region 6 Commander.

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1	MR. ADKINS: Region 6 nominates Patriot Charles
2	Anderson. Are there any other nominations for
3	Commander Region 6? Are there any other nominations
4	for Commander Region 6? Are there any other
5	nominations for Commander Region 6? Hearing none.
6	And then, what's that region I keep forgetting?
7	Region 1 nominations for Commander Region 1.
8	MR. ARNOLD: Philip Arnold Commander
9	Pennsylvania, nominate Charles Eggelston.
10	MR. ADKINS: All right. We have Charles
11	Eggelston for Commander Region 1. Are there any
12	other nominations? Are there any other nominations
13	for Commander Region 1? Are there any other
14	nominations for Commander Region 1? Hearing none.
15	The nominations are closed. We have all Region
16	Commanders unopposed.
17	MR. GARCIA: National Adjutant, sir, as
18	National Commander Garcia, the boat has been casted
19	already to during the last of the national
20	officers, the vote got casted earlier, got all
21	unopposed National Officers would be
22	MR. ADKINS: That was for these guys.
23	MR. GARCIA: But they're still considered
24	National Officers.
25	MR. ADKINS: I understand that, but it was a

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1	separate vote.
2	MR. GARCIA: I'll I made the motion that
3	didn't cast one vote for the unopposed officers.

12	on the screen.
13	So Region 4, please step up. Region 4 to
14	date, Region 4 has increased our membership 104.
15	I'm getting everybody out of the way faster than
16	not. Okay. Once again, Region 4 has brought in the
17	most members this year. So because Region 4 has
18	brought in the most members, Region 4 will receive a
19	recruiting award. This will go down to the
20	department that received the most, but I'm just
21	giving it to the region today. So on behalf of your
22	department, they gave you 105 to reach this goal.
23	Thank you so much for everything that you do. Okay.
24	Thank you.
25	The next one was Region 5. And as Region 5

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1	comes up, because I didn't tell him that he was
2	getting anything, so he just looked at me like I was
3	crazy. What are you doing? Yes. You are getting a
4	telephone award, if that's what you want to call it.
5	Reason 5 brought in 60 new members. So because I'm
6	in Region 5, my Region 5 Commander would try to give
7	me a hard time. Picture that.
8	Next, I need Region 1. Region 1, could you
9	come up here? One of you from Region 1. I don't
10	care which one of you come up, but one of you please
11	come up. So Region 1 gave us 54 new members.
12	Next, can I get Region 2? Region 2? Region
13	okay. So Region 2 is not coming up. All right.
14	Region 2 brought us in 47. Oh, there we go. No
15	trumpet this time. So Region 2 brought in 47 new
16	members.
17	All right. Region 6. Region 6, can you come
18	up, please? Region 6 brought us 23 new members this
19	year. Thank you. You brought up you gave us 23
20	new members, and we appreciate all your hard work.
21	All right. And last but not least, I need
22	Region 3 to come up, please. So out of everything
23	that we do in so many different ways, we have
24	different departments and regions that do
25	outstanding jobs. So it's not about how many
l	

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1	members they bring in, it's about how much they do
2	for the Order. And Region 3 has done more than
3	that. This Commander has worked with different
4	ladies to bring in funds for us. He has done has
5	gone above and beyond and because of you going above
6	and beyond, I am presenting you with the Phoenix
7	Award for the year.
8	MR. FERGUSON: So I know the Department of
9	Louisiana do you all have something?
10	MR. SANTINI: This is just something that we
11	Colleen so this is a little something that
12	Colleen would like to Colleen up here as well.
13	And we have this for Commander Carder Ferguson for
14	doing an outstanding job. It's just a little a
15	little something to show our appreciation. And
16	if you want to step up and take a look at it and
17	if you don't mind, those of you have not signed the
18	back of it, I have some Sharpies right here. If you
19	don't mind coming up here and signing the back so
20	that Commander Ferguson can have the honor of
21	knowing who signed and who didn't, who likes him and
22	who didn't. So just something in our to show our
23	appreciation for all your hard work and dedication
24	for the Order and what you have done and what you
25	continue to do to make it a better organization for

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1	all of us. Thank you.
2	MR. FERGUSON: This is I know many as we
3	know through the military, one of the symbols you
4	used to give for leaving is actually you get a flag
5	of your units and things here. So this really does
6	mean a lot. I from the heart, I mean, so I now
7	I got a "Love you" wall now. I got to put something
8	on there. So now I got to make a bigger spot for
9	it, so awesome. Thank you all so much. And
10	remember, it wasn't just me to make this successful,
11	it's everybody in this room. So thank you all very
12	much.
13	So I'd like all the candidates that has been
14	duly elected come up front officers I'm sorry.
15	All the officers to come up front. Online?
16	MR. LEIGHTON: Commander?

Do I have a 3 second? MR. T. ANDERSON: Region 2. Terry Anderson. 4 5 Second. 6 MR. FERGUSON: Have a second. Open for 7 discussion. 8 MR. RIVERA: Page numbers in Delegate Book. 9 MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. Definitely. PNC Rivera --10 Finance Officer Rivera. What's the cost, and has it 11 gone through the Finance Committee? Okay. 12 MR. RIVERA: It's the first that we're hearing 13 about it with a cost factor. There is a cost of it, 14 right, or is it free? 15 MR. FERGUSON: No. It's not free. 16 MR. RIVERA: Okay. So yeah. The --17 MR. LEIGHTON: That is something --18 MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. I say we table it, so --19 discussion online? Larry Leighton. 20 MR. LEIGHTON: It is not the first time we've 21 heard about it. Then he came up with the factors of 10 the numbers, if I remember right, what it was going 11 to cost for that, if the Patriots were willing to 12 pay, I think it was \$35 or \$30 a year, to get the 13 hard copy additions. Am I correct? Larry Leighton? 14 MR. LEIGHTON: We don't know the cost. We 15 don't know the total number of pages. We don't know 16 how it's going to be distributed. The 17 recommendations in the book -- let me pull up the 18 book so I can read it to you. An implementation 19 plan to be fixed in such a way that printing and 20 distribution costs are not incurred prior to 21 collecting subscription payments to cover those 22 losses. 23 MR. 3	we can finish up the convention. Okay. If we can
4	get moving because we've got to be out of here
5	within another hour. We've still got a lot of more
6	business to cover.
7	Everybody, getting to start, please, taking
8	your seat. Thank you all. Thank you, Patriots.
9	See, the quicker we get this done, if we get out
10	earlier, that's great for us.
11	MR. CANNON:
12	MR. FERGUSON: Yeah. We that's that will
13	come up. We've got finance and publication, so
14	we'll get that we still haven't finished up the
15	convention yet. Yeah. The convention, then it goes
16	to post-NEC. So before we do much anything, I think
17	we need something from greater above to keep us in
18	line, so, chaplain, would you please come up here?
19	MR. CANNON: Congratulations to all of the ones
20	that were I use the term promoted, or their
21	new positions and assignments. But as the Commander
22	said, we need to look to that higher being,
23	especially with that that has been visualized and
24	things that we are wanting to accomplish.
25	I believe that we've got great days ahead of

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1	us. I believe that. And we all pull together,
2	camaraderie, and just being who we are, combat-
3	wounded veterans, I believe something good is going
4	to happen. So I'm going to ask a blessing a
5	special blessing on the new leaders that have been
6	voted in, and I want you to join me in that, that
7	God's hand will be upon us. Let us pray.
8	Dear Heavenly Father, Lord, you have shown your
9	hand of authority upon us. Yes, there were those
10	that have been voted in their new positions. We
11	know that. But we also know that your hand was upon
12	that. Now we're asking as they assume their new
13	roles and their new tasks, we pray for thy
14	anointing. We ask for strength. We ask for the
15	vision to go forward. Now, keep us and let us not
16	forget that we are all comrades, that we're all
17	together in this thing and as one, the Military
18	Order of the Purple Heart, combat-wounded veterans.
19	Thank you, and God bless each and every one of you.
20	Amen.
21	AUDIENCE: Amen.
22	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. We're going to do a
23	ceremony that's here that's everybody have their
24	seat. I'm sorry. We're going to do a little
25	ceremony. Most people will recognize this from the

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1	military. Remember, we talked about historic history
2	and passing things on, so I'm going to ask the two
3	sergeant at arms to assist me. Naturally, ask you
4	to if you can, kind of explain the part, what's
5	going to go through this.
6	MR. ADKINS: In every military tradition in
7	every unit, when you have a change of command,
8	there's a ceremony where you pass the flag from the
9	old commander to the new commander. And that is
10	what we are going to do today.
11	It will be passed by National Sergeant at Arms,
12	to provide N. Schwartz (phonetic) to the past
13	national commander now past National Commander
14	Carder Ferguson, who will then transfer it to the
15	new national commander, Robert Olivarez, who will
16	then in turn pass it to his sergeant at arms, Gary
17	Witt. We shall now pass the colors.
18	MR. FERGUSON: Okay do it one more time.
19	Hey, like I said, we'll have an AAR on that, but
20	it's it is important. If anybody's ever been in
21	the military has, and at all the times, seen the
22	change of command, to me, that's our symbolism.
23	That is our flag. That's what we are all about.
24	And it's entrusted through the next national
25	commander, which entrusted to the sergeant at arms



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1	to take care of that. So I think that is awesome.
2	Now I want to bring it up for the good of the
3	Order. So we're going to have Keith Gray. Keith's
4	going to come up and bring up a program he wants to
5	talk about.
6	MR. GRAY: Thank you, Past National Commander.
7	Keith Gray, Department Commander, Arizona.
8	MR. ADKINS: Hey, Scott? Scott. Okay. He's
9	working.
10	MR. GRAY: So this is a program. I ended up
11	just running into a representative from the company
12	called LegalShield. All of us need to have some
13	legal protection. Some of you may already have this
14	program, but in Arizona we've kind of adopted it and
15	we are using it. And they're going to partner with
16	us and give us a cut of the subscription to get
17	signed up. We will have our own link. You'll get a
18	discounted rate on top of that, and we'll go through
19	it. Hopefully it'll pop up here in a minute. So
20	they give the presentation way better than I will.
21	The regional VP that we are dealing with is out of
22	Hawaii. I have some information on him that'll pop
23	up.
24	Essentially, just making sure our members are
25	protected. You can use it for anything. As we get
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1	older, we want to make sure our estates are in
2	order, so planning wills. If you get a little heavy
3	on the gut, golf carts around here in Florida that
4	you get a speeding ticket. They'll help you with
5	that. If you get sued, you can definitely reach on
6	to have a lawyer on-call 24/7. You can purchase
7	extra stuff on top of the base plans, like gun owner
8	plans. If you own guns, it's similar to the USCCA
9	protection that's out there, but it's the leading
10	one in the country. It's one of the biggest legal
11	protections that we have.
12	There we go. Okay. There we go. This is our
13	regional, Ben Hellinger (phonetic). He's the
14	regional vice president that is leading the way in
15	helping us and wants to make sure that all patriots
16	are protected, and he as a veteran himself.
17	This is their regional headquarters and some of
18	their partners that they partner with out of Ada,
19	Oklahoma. So you might know where that is.
20	Here's a list of some things that they help you
21	with it, and it works out. I actually have an
22	appointment scheduled when I get back for an issue I
23	was dealing with. Myself and past National
24	Commander Ferguson signed up with them and already
25	put into use.

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Again, this is some other things that they help 1 2 you with that just helps you to be legally protected, which is something I feel is big, making 3 4 sure you're always protected. You just want to 5 protect the assets that you have. And this is an additional protection for yourself to make sure --6 7 you know, identity theft. It kind of watches all 8 that, and that's part of the package that we're 9 signing up with. I've already got this done.

10 These are the current group rates. These are 11 not our discounted rates. I was told that it's in 12 the neighborhood of \$5 off for the single and \$7 off 13 for the family. They're still waiting to get us our 14 numbers. They kind of want to see how many of us are 15 going to sign up for it, and then as we pay monthly, 16 we can set up to get a little rebate. That's also 17 going to be a conversation to have with the national 18 leadership to find out how we want to receive that 19 rebate from the company. The other option we can do 20 is we can also sell this program and get a larger 21 rebate. So that's another conversation we'll have 22 and keep you guys informed and get your input on 23 that before making decisions.

Again, malicious. Some of the LegalShield, IDShield that you can get protection and additional



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1	coverages. But you also get perks for being a
2	member. So all of these companies you get discounts
3	at just by being a member of LegalShield. That's
4	it. I can try to answer any questions you have, but
5	it's really just kind of scratching the surface with
6	this and more will come to follow.
7	MR. WALLOT: But the Order is going to get a
8	cut of it?
9	MR. GRAY: Correct. The Order or the fund,
10	however it's the most beneficial to set it up,
11	whether it's a small monthly estimated payment, or
12	what we're going to fish out those details in the
13	coming days. Thank you.
14	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you, Department Commander
15	Keith Gray. And I will tell you one of the reasons
16	why I signed up for it, I didn't know how this
17	convention was going to go, so I wanted to make sure
18	I had some coverage. So all right.
19	MR. GRAY: You need to talk to a licensed
20	health agent.
21	MR. FERGUSON: I did. Yeah. I need to do that,
22	too. I am correct on that one. So I know we have
23	one more speaker, but I see two at the microphones.
24	So Pennsylvania?
25	MR. SEGWAN: Hi. Mine's a little real easy.

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1	It's a good honestly, it's a good news story, but
2	it shows why it's so important for us to have a seat
3	at the table when we're going to different
4	committees and meetings, and conferences all across
5	the nation.
6	Because of the good work of that man in the
7	corner, Phil, and many like him in Pennsylvania, we
8	recently got one of our state benefits actually not
9	going out to the veterans again.
10	To give you the short version of it, what it is
11	is in Pennsylvania, they say that veterans get 100
12	percent of their property tax. You don't have to
13	pay, right? 100 percent. You don't have to worry
14	about it. What it isn't is well, now, is they put
15	a monetary amount that you cannot make below a
16	certain point. Okay, somewhat fair. They count our
17	disability against us and our military benefits
18	against us, and that puts it above absolutely anyone
19	that has maybe a job or their wife has a job, or
20	spouse.
21	So because of the great efforts of that man
22	right there and others like him going to all these
23	meetings and pushing it it got back to where that
24	now has been redacted and it's just 100 percent for
25	those who are involved. So he, and people like him,

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1	and all of you who work on the state levels with
2	your state heads, and things on those lines, he just
3	helped thousands of veterans across the state of
4	Pennsylvania. So I just wanted to give him a round
5	of applause.
6	MR. FERGUSON: That's awesome.
7	MR. ARNOLD: Great to be here.
8	THE REPORTER: What was your name, sir?
9	MR. FERGUSON: You don't mind sharing that with
10	the national, so then that way, if we've got any
11	other departments may work on that same issue, that
12	would be something great.
13	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Please return to the mic
14	and identify your
15	MR. FERGUSON: Sorry about that. I know he's
16	from Pennsylvania. That's about it.
17	MR. SEGWAN: Shawn Segwan from the Great State
18	of Pennsylvania.
19	MR. FERGUSON: Barry?
20	MR. GASDEK: Barry Gasdek, Commander, Wyoming.
21	I'd just like to thank and give a shout out to PNC
22	Ernie Rivera for training over 350 service dogs. In
23	particular, Tango. He's been my constant companion
24	since '22, December, when my spouse passed away, and
25	actually through the day before Christmas.

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1	Having both PTSD and TBI, I needed some help.
2	And from that, Tango has been my constant companion
3	since then. He's been my Foxwell buddy and at the
4	church and a church working dog.
5	Tango's been to the National Cemetery in
6	Arlington, the National Cemetery. We attended the
7	Veteran Day's affairs. You get a chance to fly and
8	use a shuttle bus taxi, Uber, learn how to do the
9	escalators, elevators, and we were able to
10	experience and do things that I couldn't do when I
11	was 2 years old. Tango is 2, by the way.
12	Tango is actually a future alpha dog in
13	training. And you probably noticed yesterday, he
14	got a consult by Brody, who who is actually his
15	great- grandfather and so he just wanted to make
16	sure you knew that you have to he wanted to thank
17	all of you for your tolerance, patience, and
18	understanding, and then tell you that any barking is
19	just some doggy stuff. Some you might see a
20	pecking order stuff. So Ernie, thanks a lot for all
21	you do for the veterans with a service dog. I think
22	it's a fantastic program. Thank you.
23	MR. FERGUSON: Thank you. Are you good from
24	there, Ben? Are you good from there, or do you want
25	to go up?

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1	MR. KING: Yes, sir. Yes, sir. Ben
2	MR. FERGUSON: What's your name? So that way
3	MR. KING: Ben King, Virginia Department
4	Commander. Last year, I mentioned that the
5	Department of Virginia was going to develop, with
6	permission of the Order, an augmented reality Purple
7	Heart. An AR Purple Heart. What this is is a
8	capability that enables us to turn the Purple Heart
9	medal into an augmented reality symbol that can be
10	projected by anyone through their smartphone.
11	Proud to pronounce that Virginia has done the
12	job done. The AR Purple Heart exists. I can show
13	it to you in its current form. And within the next
14	month, it will be in its fullest form, accessible to
15	anyone with the link. That will all be accessible
16	through our Purple Heart Richmond website.
17	So to just repeat what I said last year, we
18	said Virginia said we would create the AR Purple
19	Heart with permission of the Order. The Order said
20	okay. And this year, it's been created, and it will
21	be finished in a month, and ready for use by
22	everyone by the end of the summer. So I just wanted
23	to pass that along.
24	MR. FERGUSON: That is an awesome job. He did
25	show me on the phone. So let's give him a round of

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1	applause. It's a lot of work. Now we're going to
2	give a briefing from the MOPH Fund.
3	MS. BROWN-GREENE: So we at the MOPH Fund would
4	like to show you an opportunity. If you well,
5	Pen left yesterday this morning. There was a
6	lady out there that's named Pen, and Pen is the
7	pretty much owner of American Dreams Program. This
8	program is set up to if you buy the program, it will
9	cover your house with all of your needs from
10	dishwashers to refrigerators, to anything in your
11	house. You will get an extreme discount instead of
12	just going to Lowe's and Home Depot.
13	For this weekend only when I say this
14	weekend only, because my mind is in the weekend.
15	Until Thursday afternoon at 5:00 p.m., we are doing
16	a deal. That means if you buy into this program,
17	which is only \$100. \$50 will go back to your
18	chapter. She is waiving her \$25 fee right now. If
19	you buy at any other time, you will get you'll
20	pay \$100, she'll get 25, the Fund will get some, and
21	your chapter will get \$25. But during this
22	convention only, you will get \$50 instead.
23	The program is it's a good program. The
24	discounts are real, and it actually works. So if
25	you would like to this is the website so you can

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see it in front of you. This is our website for the 1 2 MOPH Fund, and you can come out here to this 3 ambassador page, and it pops up for you. And you 4 can go down the page and see everything from 5 registration. You'll go down and here is where you 6 can complete the process. And if you just don't 7 want to do that and you decide, oh, well, I'll do a 8 donation, there's a donation page.

9 Here are our partners. If you have somebody
10 who wants to donate a vehicle, they can come on here
11 and follow these steps and donate vehicles. If you
12 buy any of these products, we get it right back.
13 They send us a check when you buy some of these
14 products. Thank you.

15 MR. GRAY: National Junior Vice, about the 16 American Dream Program, it originated in Arizona and 17 then was moved over to the Fund. I have had a 18 patriot in Arizona utilize that program to do some 19 simple remodeling, replacing toilets in the house. 20 And then the three toilets they replaced, they sell 21 -- saved almost double what they paid for the 22 So it is beneficial for anybody that has program. 23 any honey-to-do list. And I know in talking with 24 Pen, she says you take that list and e-mail it over, 25 her staff will do a cost analysis and show you what



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1	it would cost you to run out and do it on your own
2	at Home Depot, Lowe's, Ace, whichever hardware store
3	you use, versus going through her program. So I
4	encourage anyone in the Order nationwide. You got
5	that honey-to-do list, send it to them, let's get it
6	resolved and let's help the Order out at the same
7	time. Thank you.
8	MS. BROWN-GREENE: Thank you. Okay. Thank you
9	all.
10	MR. FERGUSON: Roger Newall.
11	MR. NEWALL: Thank you, Commander. Just want
12	to bring the Congress up to date recently with
13	legislative assistance of a friend of ours. New
14	Mexico is a Purple Heart state and we're very proud
15	of that. We have over 3,000 plus living, past and
16	present.
17	The second move with working within the
18	Department of Transportation is to take I-25 from
19	south of Las Cruces, there is at beginning, and
20	make that a Purple Heart trail. My hope is that
21	Colorado, Wyoming will pick up on that and we'll
22	have a north, south Purple Heart trail in the
23	nation.
24	MR. FERGUSON: Awesome. Has anybody else got
25	anything for the good of the Order?

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UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Boy, everybody just got quiet, huh?

3 MR. FERGUSON: I like that. So one of the 4 things I wanted to bring back up, I like traditions 5 real quick. So everybody's seen the convention 6 Each year, there's a board that's got the old pins. 7 convention pins and things that's on there. So one 8 of the things that you've noticed, this is the 9 fourth time that Orlando has hosted and been in as 10 the National Convention. But one of the things you 11 all may not have seen, the 65th that was in Tampa in 12 So I have one of the packets up here. 1997. So 13 keeping on with the traditions of handing things 14 through here, passing on. Remember that the 15 patriots are probably that held us back, what they 16 were discussing and the things that they were going 17 on, we're still carrying the torch and that's the 18 key of -- we want to pass this on and pass things 19 through here.

20 So I know that's one of the things I remember. 21 Please, and I want to tell you all thank you for 22 everything, but please remember where we're at, what 23 we're doing, and promote the Order. So, then, 24 without further ado, if there's no other business 25 that needs to be conducted for the National

13	It will not be that high. I can probably guarantee
14	you that almost, unless we move some of the stocks
15	around into defense stocks, depending on who's going
16	to win the election. If Biden wins the election,
17	it's going to be social programs in those stocks.
18	If Reagan wins the election, it's going to be
19	military stuff. We go into those stocks.
20	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You mean Trump.
21	MR. WALLOT: Or Trump. What did what did I
22	say, Reagan?
23	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Reagan. You said
24	Reagan.

14	80 percent of it of our stuff now, when we take
15	the money out, we reposition a portfolio, so it goes
16	back to an 80/20 to start the year off with, and
17	that is after the funds are withdrawn for the double
18	dip for the chapters and departments, and the 60
19	percent for national, right?
20	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
21	MR. WALLOT: Okay. Everybody knows about the
22	money. Now we got 524. Out of that, we've still
23	got the loan that's going to be paid off. That's
24	going to come out of the share for the National
25	Organization.

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1	MR. PICKART: Amount?
2	MR. WALLOT: \$4,115.60.
3	MR. PICKART: Pay out to?
4	MR. WALLOT: The general fund.
5	MR. PICKART: Thank you, sir.
6	MR. WALLOT: Okay. That's coming off of their
7	portion of 60 percent. Then the loan will be taken
8	care of. We won't talk about that anymore.
9	Okay. The only other thing we have, the reason
10	you gave me your name and address, the banker's
11	going to be calling you as well as the we've got
12	three accounts at Chase. One equity, one fixed, and
13	one ETF portfolio, exchange-traded funds. That is
14	in that is in healthcare, energy, financial, and
15	IT stuff. Those are the four big ones that usually
16	pay, okay, the highest rate of return compared to
17	utilities and other things like that. So we're
18	going to keep those four.
19	And the other thing we have is TVA bonds. We've
20	got about \$200,000 in TVA bonds. Those pay and
21	they're going to go probably lower because the
22	interest rate now. It's 100 percent that the fed
23	now the percentage rate gets. It's 100 percent
24	that the Fed's going to lower in September.
25	MR. PICKART: What's the lifetime of those

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1	bonds? They're traded any way we want to?
2	MR. WALLOT: They vary.
3	MR. PICKART: Okay. But
4	MR. WALLOT: Three years to 30.
5	MR. PICKART: Just what thank you.
6	MR. WALLOT: Okay? So when we bought them 25
7	years ago, and they renew, some of them, could have
8	been five-year bonds then that renewed last time
9	around at 2 percent year-and-a-half ago. So if we
10	sold \$1,000 bond today you were going to buy a
11	bond for \$1,000. You can buy a bond that pays 6
12	percent interest for \$1,000, or you can buy my bond
13	that I want to sell you that only pays 2 percent,
14	but you're only going to give me \$850 for it because
15	of the difference in the interest rate, okay? So
16	you're going to discount the bond because of the
17	interest rate that it's paying. All of our bonds
18	are paying less than three.
19	MR. PICKART: Wow.
20	MR. WALLOT: So we want to move a lot of that
21	stuff or at least the older ones. The older ones
22	are paying less than it. So we want to discount
23	those and get rid of some of those.
24	MR. PICKART: Who's our vendor?
25	MR. WALLOT: That is also through Chase.

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1	MR. RIVERA: Chase.
2	MR. WALLOT: That's the broker. Of those
3	bonds, I'd like to cash in the smaller ones from the
4	TVA account and balance out the portfolio a little
5	bit. Right now are cost in the four ETFs are about
6	\$30,000 a piece, and the bonds are, like, 125.
7	MR. PICKART: TVA, you charge that as utility,
8	commodity? Tennessee Valley Authority, yeah.
9	MR. WALLOT: Tennessee Valley Authority, that's
10	all utilities.
11	MR. PICKART: Okay.
12	MR. WALLOT: Okay? That's when they built the
13	water, built the dam, all that stuff. Dams.
14	MR. PICKART: And our and our previous
15	MR. WALLOT: So we want to get out of that now,
16	and I think we should go into either utilities with
17	it that's kind of our safety net. That's our 20
18	percent that's the on the fixed side. We're
19	going to get a guaranteed rate of return when we use
20	that portion, okay?
21	So I'd like to move some of that, at least
22	and rebalance that portfolio out. Right now our
23	equity portfolio and the bond portfolio are
24	basically balanced. No more than 3 percent of the
25	whole fund, the 2.5 million, basically 3 percent
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1	3 percent of 3 percent, 3 percent, one-and-a-
2	half, one-and-a-half, one- and-a-half. No matter
3	what the stock is, that's how they give you a S&P
4	average of about 8 percent a year. Last year, we did
5	18.29 percent on our money, okay? But that's
6	because we had the way it's set up and the way
7	it's fixed. I think the $80/20$ is still good for us.
8	We're perpetual, basically, and we should stay with
9	that.
10	Any questions about our money at all? How
11	that's going to work when this comes down?
12	MR. PICKART: Mr. Chairman, the reason why I
13	ask these questions is to help inform the new
14	people.
15	MR. WALLOT: Okay.
16	MR. PICKART: I'm not trying to kneel you. I'm
17	just trying to help you on and keep the railroad
18	running.
19	MR. WALLOT: You're just not trying to show me
20	how smart are?
21	MR. PICKART: No.
22	MR. RIVERA: Do we need a motion to to make
23	an adjustment on those, the 1.25
24	MR. WALLOT: I don't think so.
25	MR. RIVERA: or not?

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1	MR. WALLOT: I think it's just known.
2	MR. RIVERA: Investment.
3	MR. WALLOT: It's still in the investment.
4	We're not taking any money out of there, so but
5	the money we are going to take out of there 524,000,
6	plus another 205,000 after the loan's paid back for
7	the second payment to chapters and departments.
8	MR. RIVERA: That's coming out of the general
9	fund.
10	MR. WALLOT: Oh, that's coming out of the
11	general fund?
12	MR. RIVERA: Yeah. That's not coming out
13	That's coming out of the general fund.
14	MR. WALLOT: Well, when I send you this money
15	that gets added to the general fund
16	MR. RIVERA: Right. It's coming out
17	MR. WALLOT: It's coming out of there anyway.
18	Okay. So after we pay out the 524,000, and I'll
19	send you that as soon as you require it, we might as
20	well leave it invested in here
21	MR. RIVERA: Can we
22	MR. WALLOT: until we need the money.
23	MR. RIVERA: Uh-huh.
24	MR. WALLOT: Okay? That's going to leave us
25	with approximately where am I at here? I don't

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1	have my glasses, is what I don't have. No. That's
2	the last year.
3	MR. PICKART: Is there okay.
4	MR. WALLOT: Okay. So we got five. We got 33.
5	We're going to have about \$2.8 million left in the
6	Life Membership Fund. That used to be closer to
7	I don't think we ever got over five, but it was
8	right there. It's pretty close to 5 million.
9	What else I got in here? Okay. So you're
10	going to get two phone calls, actually. You're
11	going to get a phone call from we have the three
12	accounts that JP Morgan investment advisors have,
13	but we've got one account that's a money flop-
14	through checking account at Chase Bank with no
15	checks. It's just a transfer account between the

17	you send me money, it goes into the checking
18	account. I take it out of there and invest it.

Like you heard Jim say, 14 we made 903,000. Maybe they want an explanation for 15 that. That's what we made that one year. We made 16 900,000. This year we made 500, and last year, 524. 17 So we're doing well with the monies that we've got. 18 We just have to be able to explain it to the 19 members, and the people, and the committee. 20 MR.
